Following asbestos removal it moved on the 26th June and was seen below on the 17th July. A fresh coat of paint has been applied but restoration is expected to take 3 years.



EASTLEIGH WORKS REPORT

for the period up to 30th July 2014

General: The Diesel Running shed is almost complete with concrete laid across the front to provide hard standing. The second roller shutter door is still to be installed. The two new paint booths in the new Paintshop are almost complete and are due to be commissioned in August. The track work to the new Paintshop was completed on the 25th. 08947 was the first loco into the new Paintshop on the 29th, being used to check clearances etc into each road in turn. Ballasting of the track commenced soon after and should be complete by early August.





LU: Ex-Victoria Line trailers 4079 (see photo below) and 4179 departed on the 18th to a private location in Essex. These two vehicles have been lifted off their bogies and sold by LU to a charity called Village Underground for use as mobile events venues. The same charity has the four 1983 Tube Stock vehicles in use as artists' studios on a viaduct in Shoreditch, East London.



Locos: 66593 was on the Maritime trip on the 2nd.

66719 became the first mainline loco to use the new Diesel Running Shed on the 9th.

66589 was on the Maritime trip on the 14th.

66713 was repainted and released in early July (see photo below left taken on the 1st July). As with the previous loco (66719), this loco then took on the Westbury to Stud Farm working which returns to the Works for fuel each morning and was still in the Eastleigh area at the end of the month.

66714 arrived for repainting on the 21st (see photo below right).





47810, the first Class 47 to be so treated, looked resplendent in the new Class 68 style livery on the 1^{st} . It departed on the 3^{rd} light engine (see photo below).



59103 arrived for auxiliary generator repairs on 9th (see photo below taken on the 18th). 59002 has been repainted in Aggregate Industries livery and departed with repaired 59103 on the 24th (see photo below right).





66591 was the Maritime trip loco on the 28th.

73201 and 73207 stabled with a Test Train on 29th and 30th.

57310 departed to Willesden on the 30th and ultimately for use with FGW, replacing 57305.

66532 was on the Maritime trip on the 30th.

There are now two GBRf flows to Stud Farm, one from Westbury and the other started this week from Eastleigh. Both locos refuel at the Works in the morning and the last week of the month was 66719 on the Eastleigh to Stud Farm with 66743 on the Westbury turn.

The Network Rail 57/3s have begun transferring to DRS with 57310 the first to be repainted Oxford Blue on the 10th, followed by 57303 on the 18th and 57301 due by the end of July.

57310 had the new Cl.68 style DRS livery applied on the 21st/22nd, which is a complete vinyl wrap of the whole bodyside. It was named '*Pride of Cumbria*' on the 24th with the plates switching from 47802.





the three processes: *left* preparation 57301 (30th July), *right* re-painted without decals 57303 (9th July) and *below* 57310 completed (23rd July)



LHCS: Translators 64664 and 64707 arrived back from testing at Doncaster and East ham behind 66719 on the 7th.

37423 in new Cl.68 livery (one of three so far treated, see 37218 in **LIVERIES**) arrived on the 15th to collect DRS Escort Coaches 9419 and 9428 and took them to Crewe (see photo right).



Wagons: Freightliner wagons for General Repair have slowed in recent weeks due to a short term lack of wheelsets.

IVA 23.80.2398.645-4 arrived for repairs on the 1st behind 66061 which departed with repaired IGA 33.80.4647.016-1.

73207, 73201 and 73141 brought the final four KFAs up from the Docks on the 4^{th} ; 83.70.4574.010-2, 012-8, 016-9, 005-2 (see photo below).



66046 collected repaired IVA 23.80.2398.645-4 on the 9th.

IPA double deck car carrier 23.87.4375.004-0 has been repaired and repainted in the striking red of STVA. IPA single deck 23.87.4384.001-5 has been converted into two 2-car sets numbered 23.87.4385.002-2 and 003-0 both of which have also been repainted in STVA red.



Units: 450027 arrived during June (seen on our Members visit) for repairs to the cab of 63227 which was damaged in the storms earlier this year when it hit a tree across the line. Repairs were virtually complete by the 25th and the unit is expected to leave in early August.

Siemens have carried out overhauls to 450076 and 073 with 038 and 080 on site on the 25th.

455814 departed on the 14th and was replaced on the 15thby 455811which departed on the 30th. The next unit is due in on 31st.

DRS GRESTY BRIDGE OPEN DAY REPORT

As with last year it appears the weather gods do not favour DRS as it tipped it down for most of the day. After glorious weather on the Friday, Saturday 19th July started out very wet indeed. Certainly setting up our stand prior to the 10.00 opening time it was very heavy rain resulting in most stands moving indoors, though by this time we had already erected the gazebo, which we left up. This was a blessing in one way as it meant it was packed and we were presented with a constant stream of bedraggled enthusiasts passing the stand. Another blessing was that we were originally right next to 'Prince' which constantly blew its ear splitting whistle all day!!



There were 26 locos on site, 3 Mk2 coaches and 1 wagon, with all but three locos in DRS livery: 20308/09, 37405/419/606/608/610/682, 47810/818/841, 57002/010/011/012/306/311/312, 66429, 68002/004//006/007/008 and narrow gauge steam loco Ffestiniog Railway 0-4-0STT No.2 *'Prince'*. Apart from the steam loco the two not in DRS livery were 57306/312 still in NR yellow. However there were only two non DRS locos, *'Prince'* and 90034 which is DBS owned. The coaches were 5995/9419/9428. The wagon was PFA 92768. Also alongside the shed and adjacent the Chester line were Beilhack snowploughs ADB 965580/581 recently moved from Wigan Springs Branch.

The highlight of the event was the chance to see and inspect up close the new Cl.68s of which there were 5 to enjoy and cab. There were three inside on one track, 68006/007/008 with 68002 and 68004 outside. Incidentally the other two, 68003 and 68005 were at Motherwell and Carlisle Kingmoor respectively. With 68004 and 68008 featured in **NEW STOCK** the other Cl.68s inside are shown below, 68006 (right) and 68007 (left). The nameplate of 68006 appears yellow due to the reflection from 57312 opposite.





We had a really good day sales wise, selling over 179 books and signing up 7 new members on the day with at least another 7 joining since as a result of seeing us there. It was also great to meet so many members and mostly have a chance to chat though it was so busy that wasn't always possible and I am sure some of you passed by but didn't say hello. PRESERVATION GALAS

Norfolk Galas by Stuart Moore:

The end of May and June were a busy time for preserved railways in Norfolk. The 24-26th May 2014 was the Peppa Pig Family Fun Weekend at the Mid Norfolk Railway (MNR). Not something that would normally make these pages but as part of the event the MNR had arranged for steam to be used. The original plan was for the N2 (GNR liveried) tank engine but in the end this was booked for a filming job so the GCR kindly sent maroon Stanier 2-8-0 8F 48624 for the weekend and what a classy site it looked on a set of maroon stock. Also present that day were 31190 and 31601 on a set of Mk2s and 45133. The Peak and the coaches were pushed onto the railway by the 31's and then combined with a regular service from Wymondham to Dereham.

The next weekend was the start of the big events with The Mid Norfolk Railway West Coast Steam Gala on the 30th May – 1st June. Present were Jubilee 4-6-0 45699 'Galatea', Royal Scot 4-6-0 46115 'Scots Guardsman' and Stanier 2-8-0 8F 48151. This was a really well planned event which ran well. There were a large number of people at the event. I arrived early on Saturday morning just after the first train and the car park was nearly full. The engines performed brilliantly and were a credit to all involved.

The next event was a fortnight later at the North Norfolk Railway (NNR) with their diesel gala on the 13-15th June. (see a full report by Colin Pottle below). This had a number of visiting loco's involved but unfortunately only one of the 2 advertised class 20's appeared due to failure. BR Std 4-6-0 76084 was also used on the Sunday, the day of my visit as was 37219 which looked fantastic. It had also been used on a couple of service trains over the previous two days. The class 14 was a late replacement for the failed 20 and worked very well and was the first diesel hydraulic on the line.





The final event of the month was again at the MNR and was the Summer Steam Gala from 26-29th June. I was only able to visit this briefly and only saw Gresley 4-6-2 A4 60009 'Union of South Africa' at Wymondham (see photo right). However, the railway had 4 LNER steam locos in operation the other 3 being, 61994 'The Great Marquess', N2 0-6-2T 1744 (arrived following its filming) and Worsdell H 0-4-0T 1310. In addition a Belgian Steam train was also present. As I said I only saw the A4 running and I gather that time keeping slipped on Saturday and Sunday but again this was a very popular event and well attended.



North Norfolk Railway (NNR) Diesel Gala, 13-15th June 2014 by Colin Pottle:

Phew, what a scorcher!! On what turned out to be the hottest day of the year thus far, Friday 13th June I travelled to Weybourne on the North Norfolk Railway, arriving at about 07.30 and managed to get a parking space at the stations tiny car park. The gala wasn't billed as such, but turned out to be an all green affair with resident D5631, D6732, and D3940 giving brake van rides from Weybourne to the yard and back plus visiting D306, D9531 (ELR), D8059 (SVR). Resident 25057 was supposed to be running but wasn't repaired in time and 50007, which with 37219 had brought in D8059 and D306, didn't run due to staffing issues.



I bought a rover ticket for £18.00 on the train as no one was selling tickets at the station and travelled to Holt behind D5631 which was immaculately turned out. D5631 then took me to Sheringham (an oops moment occurred when leaving Holt the emergency brake was applied and the signalman rushed out of the box to give the driver the token!)



The day was getting warmer by the minute so I returned to Weybourne as this was the best station to take photos at. In between trains I visited the second hand book shop, which, I must say, is outstanding. Hundreds of books, ranging from steam to the present day and very friendly staff too. After a cracking mug of tea, (no paper cups here) more photos were taken.

The Colas 37219 was pressed into action later in the day but this happened after I had left, so no pictures of that working. This was the best gala I've been to this year so far, well attended without being too crowded and super weather!

Tyseley Works Open Day, 5-6th July 2014 by James Holloway:

The event was well patronised most visitors spending much time watching the activities around the turntable. I visited on Sunday, the 6th.

Locomotives around the turntable included:

Under Restoration:

Diesel: 37263, 40118 & 50021 'Rodney'

Steam: GWR 2-8-0 2885, long time resident from Moor Street station & GWR 2-6-2T 4110 **Operational Steam:** (* not in steam) GWR 0-6-0PT L34 [7752]* and LMS Jubilee 5593 'Kolhapur* 4965 'Rood Ashton Hall', 5043 'Earl of Mount Edgcumbe' and 46233 'Duchess of Sutherland' were demonstrated on the turntable and also formed up in convoy and run up and down the sidings alongside the works and turntable.

Passenger Services:

Steam: GWR 0-6-0PT 9600 and GWR 4-6-0 5972 'Hogwarts Castle' top & tailed the passenger service from Warwick Road platform to the end of the sidings and back (see photo below).

Works:

Under Restoration / Repair:

7029 'Clun Castle', 7802 'Bradley Manor', 45596 'Bahamas' and 6201 'Princess Elizabeth' **New Build:** 5551 'The Unknown Warrior' and LNWR 2-2-2 670 still under construction, a project that goes back many years.

Outside near the coal stage were Cl.08 13029 and Cl.121 DMU W55034.

In traffic were a selection of the extensive home fleet and a number of guest locomotives. The home roster included Class 14's D9531 and D9539, Class 35 Hymek D7076 recently repainted in BR Blue, Class 37s 37109 and 37324, Class 40s D335 and 345 and Class 47 D1501. Visiting for the event

were Class 31s 31271 'Stratford 1840-2001' from the Midland Railway Centre and 31466 from Dean Forest Railway, Class 47s 47401 'North Eastern' also from the Midland Railway Centre and 47580 'County of Essex' privately owned and operated by Transmart Trains. Also in operation was Deltic D9009 'Alycidon' currently on loan.



An intensive timetable was in operation with services from Heywood – Rawtenstall with departures every 50 minutes supplemented by a shuttle service operating from Bury – Ramsbottom and return, departing every hour and fifty minutes.



I arrived on the Friday at around 11.30 having travelled up from Stafford where I had been based for the previous couple of days and my first move in the gathering gloom was 2J71 11.50 Bury – Rawtenstall being propelled by 37109. Finding a spot by a vestibule window in one of the Mk1

carriages I was enjoying the sound of the English Electric engines. I also had a trip down memory lane with runoff rainwater escaping the coach's guttering and providing me with a not all together welcome shower. This set the scene for Friday as the weather closed in and the rain fell, the only option therefore being haulage with 31s, a Hymek, 37s, 40s and 47s in traffic.

Saturday was a much more promising day with the forecast suggesting that residual showers would clear away with a warm and sunny late morning predicted.

So I arrived at Bury Bolton Street in time for the 09.20 2G63 move to Rawtenstall, my first haulage of the day was behind Deltic D9009 in t&t formation with D1501. I decided to alight at Ramsbottom and remained there for much of the day as this was as busy as anywhere on the railway with a move averaging every twenty minutes. Generally the event was running to time but misfortune did strike when Class 40 D335 'sat down' whilst working 2J81 14.30 Bury — Rawtenstall just outside Summerseat. Quick thinking and undoubtedly a contingency plan saw D9009 which had been held at Ramsbottom on 2J78 despatched to pilot the marooned working onwards and D7076 was removed from the shuttle stock and placed on the late departing 2J78 once the Deltic/40 combination had cleared the single line.

The Hymek move back to Bury was my last action of the weekend before heading home and whilst listening to the engine note on the inbound journey I reflected on having seen three of the remaining four of the Class 35s in the last month, having never seen one before. Saturday had proved to be really enjoyable with a number of memorable moments, not least of which was the sight of 345 in BR blue on a rake of Mk1 stock which for me was a throwback to summer days spent on Llandudno Junction station in the late 1970s but 31271 in immaculate Railfreight triple grey with Construction sector markings was a standout.

The Swanage 35 Gala took place over the weekend of Saturday / Sunday 12-13th July 2014 to celebrate 35 years since the opening of the railway. In operation over the weekend was home traction in the shape of Class 33 D6515 'Lt Jenny Lewis RN', Class 121 'Bubblecar' 55028, rebuilt Bulleid WC 4-6-2 34028 'Eddystone', enjoying a last weekend in traffic before the expiry of its boiler ticket, M7 0-4-4T 30053 and GW Collett 5600 Class 0-6-2T 6695. Guest locomotive for the weekend was Peppercorn A1 4-6-2 60163 'Tornado' which was operating scheduled services on the Swanage Railway for the first time and had arrived behind 56303 on the 7th July from Crewe Heritage Centre..



I attended on Saturday 12th July and was at Swanage for the first departure of the day the 2M02 09.43 DMU 'Bubblecar' service with 55028 in charge. This was to be a first for the railway being the first timetabled service from Swanage to run to Motala Ground Frame, the boundary of the Swanage

Railway, and also the first not to stop at Norden. Local Press and TV cameras were at Swanage to see this departure but all eyes were quickly refocused on 60163. Indeed 60163 was to be the star of the weekend and was booked to work ten diagrams on Saturday alone including the Dining Service in the evening schedules.



Despite the intensive timetable I managed only five moves during as with seasonal good weather uncommonly wanted to get lineside photograph the action as unfolded. The timetable was such that at Harmans Cross and north there was a move taking place every twenty five minutes. Predominantly the diagrams were rostered sinale for locomotives but there was the opportunity to take the Cl.33 and M7 in t&t formation. The day became increasingly busy and it was interesting to see the pulling power of 60163.

THE SOCIETY MAGAZINE – 500 NOT OUT

This article follows on from the **40th Anniversary – The ICR Story** in February 2013 issue. The Society magazine started life as a newsletter (see below left) with a logo first appearing on the second issue. This is seen below right in the Jan 1978 issue which also shows the style of front page photo

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
used for the first time in Oct 1975. Though produced monthly from the start in February 1973, there have not always been 12

issues a year resulting in the 500th edition appearing in August 2014 rather September 2013 as would have been the case. Up until July the magazine laboriously typed on various sized paper, foolscap, imperial or A4 depending on what was available at the time and stapled as single sheets. From August 1975 the magazine standardised on a smaller A5 size, though this still varied over the vears and was stapled as a booklet as we




know today. The number of pages has risen over the years though fluctuating up until Dec 2007 when the pages increased steadily. The

number of pages was between 4 and 12 up until May 1978 with 5 issues reaching 16 pages. From Jun 1978, 16 or 20 pages was the norm up to June 2003 though it slipped back to 12 pages for 8 issues. During that period there were also 16 issues that went to 24 pages. From July 2003 24 pages was punctuated by 8 issues at 28 pages and 3 issues at 32 pages before in December 2007 consistency was finally achieved with 28 pages settled on. However with the success of our books after the end of 2009 the magazine was able to grow without directly putting up membership fees so that pages increased to 32 in June 2010, 40 in September 2011 and to 48 in January 2014.




The current title **TRACKS** was adopted in September 2008, prior to which the magazine was officially unnamed although as can be seen by the various cover designs, Inter-City was seemingly used as the logo / title up until December 1996. A block style logo was then adopted with the full Society name, be it Intercity..., Inter-City... or Inter City... as adopted now. This was supplemented from the July 2004 issue with our present day logo. This logo then doubled up replacing the block logo from September 2008. All the covers shown here are the first of the respective cover designs.




The magazine has been largely printed in black and white, firstly due to the 'primitive' technology but mostly on cost. However colour has been tried on several occasions over the years, particularly on the covers. Whilst edge to edge photos were tried for a few issues in 1988, wasn't tried again Full September 2011. colour throughout was implemented in January 2011 subsidised with the income from increased book sales.


Our 25th, 30th and 40th Anniversaries have been covered in 1998, 2003 and 2013. The 1997 style was



adapted to carry the 25th Anniversary logo, in two styles during 1998 but the covers throughout 2003 were a bit of a mess with just the wording 30th Anniversary appearing in various places along with the website address which in that year was re-designed. Only in 2013 was the cover consistent throughout the year with the use of a logo.

A handful of supplements were printed in the 1980s but as these were associated with ICRS books / pamphlets, then these will be dealt with in a separate article. Similarly an annual loco allocation sheet was printed but it is unclear as to how many or in exactly which years these were produced.













Covers apart, the inclusion of internal photographs was limited, just 653 over the first 407 issues, until an editorial change when yours truly madly agreed to take over in December 2006 when more photos were introduced to the point that 4754 have been used in the next 93 issues, 160 alone in this issue.







Along with the use of more photos, there has been a substantial increase in articles, which again were very limited in earlier issues. Many of the articles appearing since 2005 have been part of long running series with many parts, some over several years. A full list of articles

since about 2005 appears on the website.

DAYS OUT

Held over from last month, the following is one member's account of his day out to visit Eastleigh Works

Eastleigh Works Members Only Visit, 7th June 2014 by Nigel Hoskins:

With the intention to participate the Eastleigh Visit I planned a round trip that was to take 12 hours. First train was the FGW 07.59 HST from Stonehouse, my local station to Reading (1L28) using 43162 and 43192. En route were DR 79371/79273 at Swindon Cocklebury Yard, 08879/66055/66083 at Didcot Yard along with 4O40 Morris Cowley – Southampton Eastern Docks hauled by 66093 recessed until 12.15. Time for breakfast at Reading and a look at the re-development. Next train the 09.46 XC 220005 to Basingstoke (1O32). En route I passed 66416 on 4M65 Southampton Maritime – Crewe Basford Hall.

It had been raining since I left home and was still chucking it down when I arrived at Basingstoke at 10.06. In the 2½ hours I planned to stay there were 5 freights booked through which ran as follows:

6M48 – Halewood due 10.29 – cancelled 4O53 Wakefield Europort – Eastleigh East Yard passed at 10.54 with 66118 via platform 2 4O14 Hams Hall - Southampton Maritime passed at 11.15 with 66542 via platform 1 3Z07 Eastleigh Works – Derby RTC passed by at 11.20 with 31105 t&t 9702 via platform 4 4O27 Ditton - Southampton Maritime passed at 11.42 with 70015 via platform 1 6O26 Hinksey Yard – Eastleigh Yard passed through with 66515 via platform 1

At 12.33 I boarded 444015 on 2B31 to Poole and by now the sun was beginning to shine, arriving at Eastleigh at 13.00 to see a multicoloured row of 6 Cl.73s, all in different liveries. I headed straight round to the Works where my coat was put in the rucksack as now no longer needed. Safety briefing over we were let loose. First things first I headed back to the mainline to witness 6O49 Colnbrook – Wool hauled by 66555 which was to then head down the GWML as 6B11 to Pengam. I was a bit slow as I just missed 4O40 passing as mentioned above. Next was 66567 on 4O29 Crewe Basford Hall - Southampton Maritime at 14.17.

Finally off into the Works and an hour later I was heading back for refreshments though that was put on hold as I headed back to the gate to see 4O59 Wentloog – Southampton Maritime pass with 70016 in charge at 15.34. Right off to quench my thirst and some oat crunch biscuits. Refreshed I headed off to find more stock I had not seen after which I joined the queue for the hog roast.

A look at the watch and at 16.45 I headed for the exit just in time to see 66417 pass on 4O17 Lawley Street - Southampton Maritime from Campbell Road bridge. Passing 66515 waiting on 6Y81 Eastleigh — Woolston Crossover in the virtual quarry sidings, I walked past the station to Bishopstoke Road bridge to photograph the Cl.73s and the Cl.70/8s behind. The wagons for 66515 were 29523/188/233, 503553, 29215, 503136, 29077/321, 503108, 29296/284/?, 503593, 29217/149/157/111, 70.5892.019-8. Other wagons in the yard were 110233/323, 967582, 29144/365/135/520, 503573, 29555/346/354/038, 503532, 29151/303/389/361. As a matter of interest some of the locos present left Eastleigh later on Saturday / Sunday in the following consists:

Sat 21.54 73109 + 73201 on 7G10 Eastleigh Yard – Vauxhall / 22.50 73207 + 73119 + 73212 + 73107 6G11 Eastleigh Yard – Bournemouth but returned with a fault with one of the locos. Sun 01.50 70807 on 6C01 to Sholing / Sun 08.33 66745 on 6G15 to Sholing.

Time to head home now at 17.47 with 444006 on 1T62 to Winchester then 221138 to Reading on the 18.03 1E68. I passed 66024 on 6O42 Halewood - Southampton Eastern Docks near Reading West. An easy cross platform change from 8 to 9 and I was on the FGW 18.42 1G60 to Stonehouse with 43024 and 43159.

In Didcot Yard were 37607 t&t 37610 on 1Z03 test train from Derby RTC and 66106 on 4O53 Wakefield Europort – Eastleigh Yard with wagons 70.4908.100-0/148-9, 93370, 70.4908.028-3/021-8/107-5/097-8/126-5, 610007/008/378/377/348/347, 70.4908011-9/084-6/055-6/037-4132-3.






THEN & NOW

It doesn't have to be decades to see a big difference, compare the views of the turntable at Old Oak Common Depot taken on 15th December 2006 and 3rd May 2014 taken from the canal footbridge. Previously part of Old Oak Common Depot, it effectively closed in 2009 and was cleared by mid 2011 to be used as a tunnel segment manufacturing facility for Crossrail which opened in 2012. Once this is finished then the site will once again be used by trains when a servicing depot will be constructed.

Borders Railway (Waverley Route):


Following on from the report on page 34 in the January 2014 issue, the A720 Edinburgh bypass has been returned to its former alignment but now over the new railway underpass box. In the photo below taken on the 20th July looking north from the A6106 Dalkeith Road there is daylight through the box where the temporary bypass has now been removed allowing the formation to be continue unhindered.



Millerhill Road beyond is now completely closed to all traffic and pedestrians whilst construction continues, with no way of taking a photo looking south. However I took a photo (see below) on the 21st February showing the temporary bypass built across the formation. The intention was a before and after comparison...hopefully later. Sleepers are now being stacked along the route.

Further to the reports in the May and July issues, the new bridge has been completed as seen on the 19th July 2014 in the photo below. The footbridge is partially dismantled but the section still remained across the tracks. Though there is a footpath, very narrow on the north side the improved bridge is still narrow and so might be problematic to stand, even if you could see over the heightened 6ft parapets. Overhanging mirrors from lorries and buses may be a danger. There is however a restricted view to be had from the sides over the lower mesh screens.

LIGHT RAIL & METRO NEWS

Midland Metro:

Tram No.14 departed on the 17th June, not for scrap but to Long Marston to be used for tests by UK Tram. Unavailable for service are Nos.1-3 which remain at Wednesbury Depot. This leaves just 12 trams to run the service with No.4 being used sparingly. Currently some of the new trams are in use for evening training purposes and may be in public service sometime this summer. Tram 27 arrived on the 14th July making 11 so far delivered. The government's recently announced funding means that in Birmingham the line will be extended from New Street station to Broad Street to serve the National Indoor Arena, Symphony Hall and the International Conference Centre. A new line will serve the city centre to the HS2 station at Curzon Street and continuing to Adderley Park station. At the Wolverhampton end a new line to serve the bus and railway stations is planned.

Metrolink: the following information is kindly provided by Geoff Hope.

Over the weekend of 28'29th June, Manchester Victoria was closed but work overran until the 2nd July. Improvements included a new permanent track alignment now being used as the single line through Victoria. Overhead line equipment installed was not safely providing the power needed to operate the trams causing the overrun.

A flying visit to Manchester Airport on the 15th July revealed OHL in place and work on the line closed in March for construction of an extra deck re-opened ahead of schedule with the additional 119 new spaces increasing capacity to 369 spaces.

A trial scheme allowing mobility scooter users on the trams has had 32 successful applicants. Eligible users having to pass a test to show they are able to get on and off the trams safely.

A £10.8m European Regional Development Fund Grant awarded to TfGM will enable the line between Victoria and Exchange Square to be completed by summer 2015. Additional services from Shaw & Crompton on the Rochdale line to Exchange Square should be operating by winter 2015/16, the remainder of the Second City Crossing (SCC) opening in 2017. The funding will also allow the existing footbridge linking Deansgate - Castlefield tram stop with Deansgate railway station to be refurbished. A new lift and steps at the outbound end and a pedestrian bridge and steps to be built at the inbound end of the tram stop. Work is already underway with a new inbound island platform being built along with a new track configuration enabling trams to turn back in either direction should be completed

summer 2015. Attention will then focus on St. Peters Square, due to be closed for 14 months for remodelling, which will include 4 tracks, 2 island platforms to accommodate the SCC with more public space provided. As with Victoria, single line working will be operated for this period apart from 8 weeks at the start and finish of the project when no services will operate through St. Peters Square.

Announced on the 7th July was an award of £50m for transport investment to TfGM from the Local Growth Fund. Part of this money will be for the purchase of a further 12 trams, 3 for the Media City-Piccadilly line, 6 for East Didsbury - Shaw Crompton line and 2 for doubling up trams on the Airport line plus 1 spare. Also included is the installation of a new wheel lathe at Old Trafford Depot, a new substation at Brooklands (Altrincham line) and Whitefield (Bury line) with a turnback at Sale (Altrincham line) to improve the capacity of the network.

T68's 1005 & 1018 left Old Trafford depot on the 25th June and the 16th July respectively. Next in line for disposal are 1010 & 1015 after component recovery followed by 1013. On the 18th July 1003 the only T68 to carry the yellow and silver livery in public service returned to Queens Road depot under its own power to be prepared ahead of its departure to Greater Manchester Fire Service as a training aid. T68A's 2001 and 2003 departed Queens Road depot late evening the 27th June to Old Trafford depot for storage.

M5000's 3084 was observed on the Eccles - Ashton-under-Lyne service on Tuesday 15th July. 3085 arrived at Queens Road depot on the 28th June after the low loader got stuck on one of the main junctions in Manchester. 3086 arrived the 19th July both to be made ready for commissioning and mileage accumulation.

February 15th 2013: Unlike last year when we had a sightseeing tour of Shimla, today we had a steam charter booked using recently restored, 1903 built No. 520 named 'Air Messenger'. This locomotive had been out of action for many years.





When we arrived at the station the locomotive was being prepared and one person was polishing the stars and plates that were to be attached to the locomotive Once embellished, this locomotive looked a fine sight (see photo). The booked charter was to take us to Kathleeghat, and return, 14½ miles away, downhill! The departure from Shimla was delayed. Eventually we set off and then stopped at Summer Hill station, 1½ miles into the journey. The support crew, went to the locomotive and we overheard a discussion about lack of steam pressure. We soon started and after just over 5 more miles, at Taradevi, we stopped again and this time waited almost an hour whilst the firebox was emptied and massive lumps of clinker were dumped onto the trackside. We were now concerned because 192, our haul from yesterday had not arrived. What was happening? The answer seemed to be poor coal. Although this is a downhill route, for a short distance we had to climb and this was the straw that broke the camel's back. We just lost power and stopped. It was accepted that we could go no further and 192 was attached and brought us back to Shimla.

February 16th 2013: A non railway day to see the sights of Shimla. An early evening departure back to Kalka, arriving with plenty time to connect with the 2345 Kalka Howrah Mail (sleeper) as far as Tundla the following day. Our train locomotive was class WAP-7 30329. Two other class members were also present.


