A Life on the Railways

In this issue we continue with Michael Smith's very detailed history of his life on the railway, from shunter to Station Manager.

Part 3 – Further up the Ladder:

When you become a salaried grade you changed your brass buttons to black ones. The London Underground had turnups on their trousers. At Liverpool St, the Ticket Inspectors were in two gangs, the general inspectors were Divisional Managers staff under George Joscelyne and the fraud squad were Class 3 under Bill Mitchell and were General Managers York staff, able to work at all three Eastern region stations including King's Cross. The Class 4 Inspectors worked at Liverpool St and Fenchurch St during the rush hours, as at Liverpool St the traffic was very heavy, two 12 car electrics arrived side by side on opposite platforms every 3 to 4 minutes apart, often with compartment stock holding 12 passengers seated and up to 12 standing, not too good in hot weather!! Brass band music was played on the loud speakers in the morning to get the passengers moving and light music in the evening. We collected excess fares and any passenger asking for a ticket close to London, for example Stratford was questioned about the station, was there a bridge or tunnel etc, and when the passenger admitted coming from a further station, we had to issue the caution as we operated under Judges Rules and kept very complete notebooks. This meant we had to go to court, very often at the Guildhall if we were at Liverpool St and the Mansion House with the Lord Mayor of the City of London as Chairman of the Bench.

Other duties were first class protection, this was done by standing on the platform at Billericay or Harold Wood, the last stops before London, where we would open the doors of the first class compartment and order all second class ticket holders to leave. This they did without too much trouble. Another way to protect the first class was to ride in the compartment with the passengers and wait until the last stop, put our hats on which we carried in a black bag and ask for their tickets, any who held second class tickets were charged the difference up to first class. If a person came under our notice more than once we would issue a warning that next time we saw them in the first we would not speak to them, but on arrival at Liverpool St if they did not offer to pay the difference between first and second they would be stopped and their details taken and reported for ticket fraud.

Another way we had to work to stop ticket fraud, which was very common in the east London area where we worked, was to go to Southend Victoria. One Inspector would go into the Booking Office and watch the passenger buy a ticket to the next station, Prittlewell; he would take down the number of the ticket issued and follow the passenger onto the platform joining his fellow Inspector. They would then sit near the ticket holder until he or she changed trains at Stratford onto the Central line and on arrival at whatever underground station the ticket holder got out, we would follow him up the stairs getting to the barrier ahead of him, as he asked the LT ticket collector for a ticket from the last underground station. We would take over showing our authority, produce the ticket number he had purchased at Southend and put him forward for prosecution for avoiding the portion between Prittlewell and the underground station he had asked for. When we worked with the fraud squad we performed clip-ins, this meaning we blocked a station like Barking or Stratford with a large number of Inspectors and we would ensure nobody passed us without a valid ticket onto the trains. So at Liverpool St or Fenchurch St the squad would know that as soon as a passenger asked for Stratford or Barking he or she had to have come from further down the line and without the passenger admitting coming from another station he would then be reported for fare evasion. The courts knew us well and always took our word. This changed after I left Liverpool St. Southend Court was a very good court and would back the Railway Inspectors at all times. When they arrived on the Bench they would call out good morning to each Inspector!!

We also worked the last of the Royal Dock passenger trains where steam shunting engines still worked in the docks. Ford Works also had steam as well as early diesels with a chrome FORD on their sides.

Forgery of season tickets often happened and three of my interceptions ended up at the Old Bailey on forgery and uttering charges, fines being much higher. At most Courts the fine was up to £10.00 with costs. One of the most interesting jobs was on the Tilbury to Gravesend ferry, the cases had to be heard under the Maritime Act and the fine was a maximum of £2.00 but costs were added.

Network News - 1 by Trevor Roots

A couple of pieces of news not previously reported at the time...took a while to get out for photos.

Laurencekirk Station:



Laurencekirk station between Montrose and Stonehaven on the Edinburgh to Aberdeen line has been refurbished and re-opened (closed 1967). Having successfully campaigned for 16 years, local residents saw the station officially opened on 18th May 2009. Though initially only served by ScotRail services it is capable of handling the longer East Coast and Cross Country services. Passenger numbers have been higher than expected. The photo taken on 5th July 2010 is looking south from the new footbridge. The existing small yard northwest of the station is still in use.

Carlisle Station:

Prior to its starring role in a Homebase TV advert, the long closed buffet at the bufferstops on platforms 5 & 6 was demolished. When Homebase then vacated the area it has left a cleared area not seen for many years. Though it is eventually intended to provide screens and seating the open area does now give clear views of trains at the platforms from the station entrance and footbridge.

Wolverton Works Open Day, 14th & 15th August 2010: CANCELLED

Disappointingly we will not now be going to Wolverton as you will see from the statements below, Railcare have 'postponed' the event.

Railcare Statement: 18th July 2010

"It is with regret that we have to announce the postponement of the Wolverton works Open Weekend as scheduled for the 14th and 15th of August 2010. Unfortunately ticket sales have been much lower than anticipated and as such we will be unable to support the event.

The open day is not only arranged so that Railway enthusiast can access our historic site; it is also there to support and contribute to the local community and nominated charities. Without the ticket sales we won't be able to do this and maximize the huge effort put in by all involved losing much needed return and value from the weekend.

Our choice to postpone and not cancel the event means that the hard work by individuals so far will not be lost and a better understanding of the low tickets sales can be achieved to help support a more successful event in the summer of 2011.

I have no doubt that everyone who has been actively involved and those looking forward to enjoying the weekend will fully understand the decision that has been made and the important reasoning behind it.

We extend our apologies for any disappointment and disruption we might have caused and look forward to your continued support into next years event"...many won't risk another debacle, ed.

Railway Magazine Statement: 22nd July 2010

The Railway Magazine can confirm that, due to circumstances beyond our control, the Wolverton Works Open Weekend (August 14/15) will not be taking place. This was a decision taken by RailCare, the operator of Wolverton Works. Regrettably, The Railway Magazine was not consulted prior to this decision being taken.

Last year's Eastleigh weekend was, in fact, one of the most popular rail open events ever staged in the UK with more than 19,000 people attending. 
DRS Gresty Bridge Open Day, 10th July 2010:

Preservation News

Heritage Shunters Trust, Rowsley (Peak Rail) by Trevor Roots:

With 25 ex-BR diesel shunters, 2 ex-industrial diesels and 3 ex-industrial steam locos amongst other stock under their care, HST has recently constructed a two road shed to house at least part of their unique collection. Though many are still open to the elements there is room to now house 14 locos under cover and on the day I visited there were 13 so protected, left road: D9500, D2199, D2587, 03027, 06003, D9502 right road: 08016, 'Bigga', D2953, PWM654, 03099, D2854 & D2868.

All their other stock (except 0-6-0 Austerity 3183, away at Locomotion, Shildon) was on view in with 3 locos, 03113, 12061 & D2866 in the workshop together with the 6T Coles crane (see photo opposite)

East Lancs Diesel Gala 2nd – 4th July 2010 by Andrew Woodcock:

Due to work commitments my visit was on the Friday but what a surprise as the weekday rover tickets are much cheaper than weekend and with my senior pass it only cost me £12.50 for the day. Coming by road from the east I decided to give the Manchester side a miss to avoid congestion and parking charges, so it was off to Heywood and its free car park. Only a pity it did not open until the first train arrived top and tailed by the two class 33s. Signposting from the M62 is excellent until the last few hundred yards when you run out of signs, probably nicked.

The weather was excellent and the day went well, the only drawback was that some trains did not have a buffet car open and Rawtenstall buffet was closed. Passengers out in good numbers for a Friday enjoyed a mixture of single locos, double headers and top and tail operation. On arrival in Bury on the first train from Heywood we had the sight of 4-6-2 71000 'Duke of Gloucester' with support coach coming into the station from the Ramsbottom side and at a guess following the service train to Heywood and then off to main line duties.

I enjoyed a good day out at a reasonable price with no car parking problems.

Manchester: The delivery of the new trams is continuing with the arrival of 3016 at the end of May but unfortunately only 3002-3012 are able to be used as 3013-3016 have incompatible technology with Manchester's current signalling system. The new extensions from Droylsden to Ashton-under-Lyne and Chorlton to Didsbury have received the funding and will go ahead even with the spending cuts.

Birmingham: The new proposed link of the Midland Metro from Birmingham Snow Hill to Birmingham New Street is to be re-examined.

Southend: The funicular cliff lift on the seafront at Southend-on-Sea has been officially opened after a five year refurbishment and is now carrying passengers from Clifton Terrace to Western Esplanade. In the summer months it will be open from 10.00 to 17.45 daily.

WAGON NEWS:

A new era of co-operation has started with DBS now utilising the DRS Coatbidge – Inverness intermodal service on two days a week by attaching 8 BP TTA tankers. They will then be forwarded onto Lairg by the Inverness based DBS CI.67 between sleeper duties.

A number of PAA Sand Hoppers have been taken out of service because internal rust problems which has been contaminating the load so a solution might be to convert redundant HTA Coal Hoppers to carry sand instead.

A derailment occurred at St. Blazey when a JIA Polybulk wagon split the points and demolished two signals.

WAGON REVIEW by Martin Hall:

BNFL Nuclear Flask Wagon - FNA

These vehicles are a batch of 56t Bogie Flat Wagons coded FNA(C) and designed to carry a waste nuclear flask. Numbered 550027-050 & 550051-060 these wagons were built in two batches by Procor (UK) in 1988 & 1989 respectively to the design code FN003F. They were fitted with FBT6 bogies and the nuclear flask was actually seated underneath a white hood that sat in the middle of the wagon. These wagons are used all over the country to collect spent nuclear fuel and take it to the Sellafield Reprocessing Plant in Cumbria. The bodywork was originally un-painted but they finished up a sort of browny livery. Earlier versions coded FNA(B) were basically the same but were 50t in weight and built at BR works:

Shildon - 550000-005 (scrapped) built 1976 and 550017-550018 built 1982


Ashford - 550009-016 built 1976 and 1978, **Swindon** - 550019-026 built 1984-86.
