Editor's Comments:

The AGM held at the Nene Valley Railway proved a huge success and was well attended, see Report elsewhere.

With the death of Maggie Thatcher recently and the 1984/85 coal miners dispute reignited, it is strangely coincidental that the UK coal industry has suddenly gone into meltdown which is and will have a major impact on coal transportation by rail. It is sad to report more unexpected pit closures on top of those mentioned last month. Maltby has closed leaving only three deep level pits operating, of which Hatfield is compromised by the recent slagheap slide and Scottish Coal has gone into administration shutting six opencast sites in East Ayrshire, South Lanarkshire and Fife. With power stations switching to cleaner biomass the future for UK coal is looking doomed. On top of this the Office of Rail Regulation (ORR) wants to charge more for long distance coal trains including biomass so possibly forcing traffic from rail to road. Where is government's joined up thinking?

On my way back north I hunted out the new Gogar tram depot in Edinburgh, not too difficult as it transpired and a report of progress around the depot and a short description of the trams are included in **Light Rail & Metro News**.



AGM Report - Sat. 13th April 2013 by Trevor Roots:



With the day starting relatively warm (after weeks of biting cold) and sunny we set up our stand at 09.00 and all looked set for a good event with anticipated attendance higher than in recent years. Members trickled in during the morning to be greeted by officials on our stand and the sight of the newly released UK Pocket Book. Once the first service train (see photo right had returned from Peterborough carrying members we embarked on a guided shed tour at 12.00. In the workshop was 34081 '92 Squadron' being completely overhauled and class 14 D9520 / 45 under service (see opposite top). On leaving workshop the party can be seen gathered around very worn looking steam ash pans. We then toured around the other sheds where 31108. the only operational resident UK mainline diesel loco (notwithstanding the two class 14s), was buried in a position unsuitable for decent photos, only to be dragged out once the railcar trip departed.



We returned to the platform to catch our specially chartered trip in Swedish railcar 1212. But with the weather deteriorating and the wind getting up the stand needed securing so yours truly stayed behind whilst the 1212 trundled off westwards to Yarwell at 12.50 on the short first leg of the round trip. By staying behind I was also lucky enough to see 31108 dragged out (see photo below) and in a position



over Wansford so that by the time of the railcars return it was drizzling (as can be seen from the front cover photo). On joining the railcar I found the party to be already tucking into an excellent lunch of rolls etc, which was being served by efficient NVR staff. The railcar was very comfortable and was split into two compartments, one with 24 seats and one with 20 seats. The driving cabins were very capacious with the driving position set back from the curved front. In photos of the interior four officials can be seen in the lefthand photo, Simon Mutten (facing), Stuart Moore (head turned), Peter Britcliffe (bald head to right of Stuart) and Carl Watson (standing). Of note in this picture is Jack (standing). Carl's son, probably our youngest member and Brian Thompson (sitting far

Eastleigh Works Report

General: South West Trains has announced plans to spend £40m upgrading its class 455 fleet. This will be done at Eastleigh after a trial train is done at Wimbledon. Exact details of how and when are still awaited

Locos:

31465 was based at the Works with a Test Train week ending 5th but suffered a failure and was taken inside and repaired by the 11th.

07007 has been taken out of service for some much needed care and attention. 08650 taking its place as it needs testing and shake-down following repairs.

08650 received Aggregate Industries branding on the 11th, thus creating yet another livery variation. It is due to leave in early May.







57311 arrived for repainting on the 11th, towing 47832 for repairs (see photo above right). This gave us, briefly, both Northern Belle liveried 47s on site at the same time. 57311 was in white primer by the 26th.

57002 is being prepared for repainting.

Two Test Trains were stabled on the 16th; 31233, 72612, 999605 (UTU2), 9701 (see photo above left) and 73201, 9481, 977983, 999550, 6261, 73107.

66743 has received repairs to its fuel tank.

47813, 47841 and 47802 brought some coaches to the depot next door on the 24th (see **Traffic & Traction News**) and then arrived at the Works where 47841 was dropped off for repairs. The other two 47s departed on the 25th back to the depot with repaired FO 3267 *'Belvoir'* (see **Traffic & Traction News**) where they collected more coaches and headed back north



Coaching Stock:

975290, Test Car 6 is currently being stripped of asbestos and will be scrapped once completed. VSOE BSO 9502 has been painted in a white primer prior to full repainting.

73141 and 73206 arrived on the 16th with two sets of translators, 975875 and 977087 for the 508

move the following day and 975974 and 975978 for repairs (all translators were seen in Tonbridge West Yard on the 14th)..

Repairs to Porterbrook translators 6376 and 6377 have been completed.

DRS TSO 5810 is now in DRS blue. BSO 9525 should follow suit very soon.



64649 (508201) + 64712 (508209) at Southampton Docks, 17th April

Units:

Siemens have carried out modifications to 450553, 024, 552, 086, 567, 037, 556 and 002. 455834 arrived on the 3rd and departed on the 18th. 455833 arrived on the 19th and will depart in early May

458025 arrived on the 24th (see photo below) for testing of the two repaired Porterbrook translators. Testing took place on 25th and the unit departed on the 26th.



Two class 508 vehicles, 64649 from 508201 and 64712 from 508209, have been prepared for use as training vehicles for Merseyside Emergency Services at their Seacombe location. The two vehicles departed to Southampton Docks on the 17th behind 73141 and 73206 with 66742 bringing up the rear (see **Traffic & Traction News**). Angel Trains BR blue translators 975875 and 977087 were used as well as Arlington green liveried 975974 and 975978. 57310 had been planned to be used as brake force but the Arlington liveried translators were used instead as their repairs were completed in time. The full formation was 73141, 73206, 975875, 64649, 64712, 977087, 975974, 975978, 66742.

Class 508 vehicle 64692, from 508201, has been stripped and lifted off its bogies and is in the scrap area awaiting the cutters torch (see photo below).

Track Machines:

The Speno Rail Grinder, DR79221-226, arrived on the 19th for its annual maintenance slot and is expected to depart sometime in May



Wagons:

56303 arrived on 5th to collect repaired JRAs 6790 058-5, 030-4, 088-2, 051-0. 56303 was back on the 8th (see photo below left) with more JRAs for repair, 6790 060-1, 085-8, 049-4. The three JRAs had been repaired by the 26th and awaited collection.





66954 collected repaired FLAs 606007, 605003, 605023, 605026, 606009 on the 8^{th} . 66591 arrived with FSAs 608209, 608210 for repair on 15^{th} and departed with repaired KTAs 97733, 97762 and KFA 92561 (see photo above right).

Repatriated A4s:

Further to the report in the November 2012 issue and update in January 2013 issue here are the latest views of 60008 'Dwight D.Eisenhower' (opposite top) and 60010 'Dominion of Canada' (opposite bottom). 60008 has now been cosmetically repainted in BR Brunswick lined green and is now on display alongside 4468 'Mallard' around the turntable at NRM York. Meanwhile at Shildon 60010 has had its front end damage repaired, side valences and bell fitted and as shown below, is in the process of being repainted. Both photos were taken on the 12th April 2013.





Infrastructure News

East Grinstead:

Coupled with the completion of the northern extension to the Bluebell Railway into East Grinstead, the mainline station has also been completely rebuilt with new parking facilities, ticket barriers and lengthened platforms.





East Croydon:

As part of a major revamp of the station to increase capacity and flow, a new footbridge spanning all tracks has been erected to the north end of the station replacing the subway which has been taken out of public use. Eventually new station entrances to the town centre via Cherry Orchard Road, Ruskin Square and Dingwall Road will be created connecting to both the western and eastern sides of the footbridge.

Whitchurch:

A new footbridge has been erected at Whitchurch to replace the existing structure, which can still be seen in place on the right of the photo taken by Roger Thomas on the 20th April 2013. Disabled ramps are to be added once funding is available.



Roberts Road, Doncaster:

The redevelopment of the ex-Fastline facility on the site of what was previously the Hexthorpe OHL Construction Depot south of Doncaster station can be seen taking shape behind 66701 passing with a rake of JXA wagons (plus 3 assorted tacked on the back) on the UP Sheffield Goods Line towards Doncaster. Very apt, as it is GBRf who is building the new maintenance facility.

Bluebell Railway:

Following the report by Mark Richards in the last issue here are further photos of the new Bluebell Railway facilities at East Grinstead. Since my visit a canopy has been erected in front of the ticket kiosk and 09018 was delivered on the 23rd April to Sheffield Park, in striking HNRC livery. Once commissioned (and re-liveried) the other resident 08 shunter 13236 will leave the railway.

Light Rail, Metro & Tram News

Edinburgh: The track between Gogar Depot and the airport is now being used to commission trams as with 271 seen below on the 23rd April 2013 at unnamed Gogarburn, the first stop just 200 metres west of the depot alongside the A8. The following photos were all taken on the same date to illustrate the depot and surrounding works.



Gogar Depot is west of Edinburgh city centre and north of the junction of the A720 Ring Road and the A8. Between the A8 and the depot are the double track through lines, off which points allow access as shown by tram 271 on the extreme left in the photo below. Inside the boundary fence are 4 loop tracks, the first outside, the other 4 passing through the building. These tracks, which originate from the single lead track shown below, loop right around the building to the eight track fan of stabling sidings. The fan also leads out onto a single track which with the loop line access track run under the access road bridge (see photo at the end). The sidings appear capable of holding 29 trams, 3 rows of 8 and then a further 5 at the western end as determined by the walkways.



21 trams (19 stabled) can be seen in this view of Gogar Depot from the A8 / A720 roundabout, the depot access road from the roundabout passes over the through lines in the foreground and curves around beyond the stabling sidings to the depot gates trams in front from left to right: on test 271, 276 & stabled 261, 253, 265, 262, 266, 254, 260



the stabling sidings from grass bank on the north side of the access road stabled trams from left to right: 273, 275, 274, 272, 264, 270

The 27 CAF built trams as can clearly be seen are a bit snake like as their 42.8m long bodies are articulated in seven sections allowing them to negotiate a few sharp 90° bends. There are six sets of doors on each side in five of the sections. The centre section has two but the two sections either side of the centre have none. At present the trams are all in unbranded white relieved only by the red stripe. They will be re-liveried once Lothian Buses take over the operation.



as seen from the access road, tram 275 departs the stabling sidings to curve round to the rear of the depot building as then seen in photo opposite top



from further west along the A8 the rear of Gogar Depot can be viewed with tram 275 which had just curved round from the stabling sidings, similar to the shuttle track at Cheriton (only a bit smaller !!)

Gogarburn tram stop is 100m along the through tracks on the right (behind the camera)



unlike the finished article to the west, to the east of the access road bridge it is still a scene of major construction works which is to be Edinburgh Gateway, the through tracks on the far side of the cutting curve south under the A8, in the foreground the two lead tracks into the depot are connected by double slip points

Metrolink: Three of the T68a trams have now been withdrawn from service, 2002, 2004 and 2006.



We arrived at Mettupalayam Junction and our train was already in the platform. We were to be hauled (pushed) by 0-8-2T 37392. On shed were 37389 and 37397. At the time I was unaware that 37397 was only days old! (see photo opposite bottom). Strange to believe that classmate 37385 is already preserved at the National Railway Museum in Delhi. Many of this class are now oil burning. Our destination was Coonoor. On route we stopped at Hillgrove station for Peaceful, until swarms of monkeys descended and engulfed the train, pillaging food and snacks.

On arrival at Coonoor the depot contained 4 steam locomotives and 2 diesels. Outside the station 37390 was plinthed. From here to Udagamandalam we were diesel hauled by 6724. Udagamandalam is better known as Ooty. India Railways have a large number of metre gauge diesels and on shed was 6399 and 6730.

On route to Ooty we passed 6401 coming down. The norm for this line is steam to Coonoor then diesel to Ooty. A few years ago a local businessman campaigned to get steam back to Ooty. The authorities argued that lack of watering facilities was the problem. This businessman paid to re-instate the water crane at Ooty and a couple of steam trains ran then for some reason it reverted to diesel! Of note, despite Ooty being the end of the line, nothing is stabled there overnight.

March 1st **2012**: A non railway day visiting tea plantations and botanical gardens. There is a large lake outside Ooty with many attractions including a miniature railway. Sadly, today, the locomotives engine was scattered all over the platform. It will work tomorrow I was told. Then the pigs flew over!

March 2nd 2012: Already at the end of the tour. It has been a wonderful experience. For haulage, I was disappointed that both locomotives were the same ones that brought us up. Our train from Ooty was a private charter, not timetabled, and at Hillgrove there were no monkeys. They must only know the scheduled times!

After arriving at Mettupalayam a coach took us to Coimbatore airport for the flight to Mumbai (Bombay) then home to London.


ICRS Publications
