The reverse of the carrier sheet will be printed with a Renewal form, which can be returned or not, depending on the method of payment (see below). If no renewal is forthcoming after a Reminder form and one month after your expiry date then your membership will be deemed to have lapsed. Please make sure you provide a telephone contact number. If you are ex-directory, don't worry as it will not be revealed to any third parties but it is important that we are able to contact you other than by post, which is a costly way to communicate and not covered by the membership fee. As a helpful 'reminder', members who have set up a bank standing order will have a note to that effect on the front of the carrier sheet but no renewal form on the reverse. Hopefully then no one will renew twice, as has happened !! PLEASE RENEW by the due date, unless you state a reason for the delay. Standard Members are given a short period of grace to allow post to arrive but if paying by BACS there is no reason to delay as the membership for eMembers, by its very nature, lapses on the end of month due date. If you are not renewing please have the courtesy to say so.

If you renew in the first week of the month, whilst **TRACKS** is at the printers, you may receive a Renewal / Reminder form but do not worry as the admin process will naturally see things cross in the post. Please also note that cheques are not presented to the bank until the first week of the following month. As well as receiving a new card, renewals will be acknowledged where possible by email.

NB. When using PayPal, please read and follow the instructions on the relevant web page.

Membership Cards: Your membership is valid until the end of month as shown by the first two numbers. For those who joined from mid 2009, the second two numbers are the year. Cards will be sent as soon as practicable following your renewal, separate from **TRACKS** distribution. No card is sent to international **eMembers**.

Locos:

37219 t&t DBSO 9702 left with a NR test train to Hither Green on the 2nd.

66747 took barrier set T5 ADB975974/978 to Peterborough on the 4th.

66743 arrived for a repaint into Royal Scotsman livery on the 6th departing for Doncaster Roberts Road on 30th (see **LIVERIES**).

66424 in new DRS livery left for Willesden Brent on the 11th (see photo right).

37175 t&t 37254 were on and off, site with a NR test train between the 9th and the 12th.





58008 was shunted inside for the power unit to be lifted out on the 9th (see photo above), returning to the scrap yard on the 10th and scrapped by Raxstar by the 12th. Both cabs, the power unit and one bogie have been saved for re-use as well as many other components.

37421 t&t DBSO 9708 were on and off site with a NR test train on the 13th.

66848 brought in 37175 t&t 37254 and NR test train on the 13th. They had failed at Staines en-route to Tonbridge West Yard. 66848 then left to stable alongside Eastleigh Station.

66769 returned Barrier Set T7, 64664/64707 from Peterborough on the $16^{\rm th}.$ The same consist left for Doncaster Works Wagon Shops on the $20^{\rm th}.$

73963 + 73965 arrived from Tonbridge West Yard to collect the NR test train and take it to Woking Up Yard on the 17th

66744 arrived for an Exam on the 23rd. It left the same day then returned the following day with 66750, which had failed. 37175 + 37254 left for Barrow Hill Roundhouse on the 25th.

57007 in new DRS livery moved to Willesden Brent on the 25th (see photo right).





57309 has been repainted in DRS blue in preparation for the new DRS livery to be applied in early June.

50026 was shunted into the workshop on 24th to have replacement fire bottles lifted in preparation for our event on the 4th June and its planned summer activities on the gala circuit.

ST PHILIPS MARSH DEPOT OPEN DAY

The Open Day at St Philips Marsh Depot, Bristol to celebrate the 40th anniversary of HSTs entering service was held on the 2nd May 2016 and was attended by several members. The main report is by Andrew Buckley. I have included photos, throughout **TRACKS** as appropriate by all who submitted them, but as you can imagine I had multiple choices.

Andrew Buckley: Having arrived early and taken the opportunity to do a recce of the site perimeter and also partake of a speedy breakfast, it was very encouraging to join a queue, around twenty minutes before curtain up that stretched some 150 yards down the road. Indeed, by the end of the day, word of mouth suggested a number through the door well in excess of 4000.

Along with some eight HST power cars, each resplendent in a different company or other unique livery, there were some fourteen diesel locos representing motive power in many cases seen on lines prior to the introduction of the HST. Other motive power included one steam loco, two remote controlled depot shunters, DMUS 150232 and 166214 (GWR livery), 158798 (Springboard Charity livery). The display was completed with assorted coaches and wagons.



Initial thoughts on entering the depot, apart from an appreciation of the crowds present, was that a clear and considerable thought had been given to the layout of the locos and power cars present. Sensibly the central, long stabling area of the site had been utilised for the main Locomotive and Power Car display but what also struck was the consideration given to access and photography. The bulk of the HST power cars were laid out in a very photogenic arc to the left of the display area and behind them adjacent and to the right of the entrance, were the other locomotives all nicely spaced apart from each other to allow a reasonable three quarter shot, or in the case of the '50's grouped together to give an early 1980s depot feel. All were also superficially, at least, in very good condition to the eye with many of the locos being in an ex-works state.



My initial trek around the depot took the best part of an hour and a half to complete, in part for the ground to cover but also because of the obvious wait for the shot you were looking for to materialise in consideration of the other people who were there. In the main I thought that this was generally good humoured although as the weather deteriorated one could understand a sense of exasperation creeping into the equation. The weather did however intervene with a solid two hours of relatively heavy rain which eventually cleared away around at 15.30. By that time the crowds seemed to have thinned and the light was considerably better with bright and directional sunlight. However, many of the HST Power Car cabs were by this time now hosting visitors and as such getting a clean shot was proving tricky.

The undoubted star of the show was HST power car W43002 which looked superb in the original Intercity 125 livery and brought back strong memories of my first sightings at the nearby Temple Meads station just a few weeks after they entered service those many years ago. The HST still retains the record for the fastest diesel in the world with a speed of 148mph and its longevity is indeed some testament to its success in service.



My only minor niggle would be that as part of this celebration there was not more of a focus on the Mk3 coach which in many peoples' eyes is the best rolling stock to run on BR metals. That said this was a superb day out and one that I thoroughly enjoyed.







Cardiff Central Station:

Work started in June 2014 to improve access and capacity at Cardiff Central. There are two entrances both below track level, the main concourse at the northern side from Central Square and the southern entrance off Tresillian Way where a new two storey entrance and booking hall has now been created. 


In addition a new platform 8 on the northern side is being created and is seen below on the same date prior to completion and the laying of track. In conjunction with the works to the railway station, Central Square, which housed the bus station and closed in 2015, is being totally revamped with new buildings and a new transport interchange, the later about to start in June 2016.

Telford Steam Railway (TSR): Infrastructure work has progressed with the platform at Horsehay & Dawley being extended and the southern section beyond the Bridge Road cleared A

Further ambitious expansion south is planned eventually to Buildwas PS site via Ironbridge Gorge, but requires major work. More on the TSR in a future article explaining their route and showing their main station and stock yards at Spring Village.

PRESERVATION GALAS

North York Moors Rly 'Scottish Branch' Gala, May 2016 by Colin James;

I made a trip to the North Yorks Moor Railway for the second Friday of their 6 Day, two weekend Scottish Branch line event. Originally set to be the Spring Steam Gala, the non availability of the Keighley based coal tank and Didcot based 2-6-2T 4144, meant a change of plans.



Already scheduled to visit the railway for the steam gala, Llangollen based BR Std 4MT 2-6-4T 80072 did make the journey and it was subsequently joined by Deltic 55022 (masquerading still as 55007 'Pinza') and 26038 'Tom Clift' from Bo'ness & Kinneil Railway. The home fleet engines working were D7628, 37264, Stanier Black 5 4-6-0 45428, BR Std 4MT 2-6-0 76079 & LNER Q6 0-8-0 63395 with DMU 101685.



Opting for a Scottish theme allowed the organizers to re-number the steam engines for the event. On the Friday of my visit, 80072 ran as 80007 (It ran as 80126 on the first weekend), 45428 ran as 44783 (also carried 44970 during the event) & 76079 ran as 76101 (also carried 76001 during the event).



Unfortunately not in service on the Friday, 55007 (55022) did work services over the preserved line and on the Whitby – Battersby section of the Esk Valley line during the event. The basic timetable on

the preserved line was approximately an hourly service, with some Grosmont – Goathland shuttles worked by the DMU, with a goods van B775340 attached (see photo right). D7628 worked the 3 Grosmont – Whitby services, top and tailed by 76101 (76079) on 2 of them.

For the general service pattern 4 rakes of carriages (3 rakes of 5 & 6 Mk1 coaches & 1 rake of 6 LNER teak coaches) were in use, with the Dining train (a set of 7 Mk1 & Pullman carriages) running at lunchtime.

The timetable was relaxed enough to cover any delays that happened and loadings were good for a Friday and the chillier, damper weather conditions.

Visiting locomotives: 20142, 20205, 5580 (33162), D213 (40013) 'Andania', D832 'Onslaught', D182 (46045) & 50035 'Ark Royal'. 66748 which had brought a number of the visiting engines to the line was stabled in the carriage sidings at Swanage.

Carl Watson: The Preview Day on Thursday 5th May once again celebrated the ever popular Waterloo-Exeter route (62) with, D6515, D832 and 50035 all in action during the day. This is always the quietest of the four days but there were still a good number of visitors and we did reasonable business on the sales stand.

The Gala proper kicked off on Friday with the full list of visiting and home locos taking part. Throughout the weekend timings were broadly kept to and any slippage quickly caught up. 50035 did fail on the Friday evening with a fuel leak and had to be rescued by D6515 which arrived back at Swanage sporting code 62....Class 33 fans were quick to point out that this was a regular feature on route 62! 50035 was repaired and back in use the following morning.

D213, for me (and Lou!) was the star of the show, looking immaculate in BR green. It performed its first passenger runs since BR days and it was the first appearance of a Cl.40 at Swanage. D832 was a very close second for me and represented the first visit of a Warship to Swanage. D182 in its 'chromatic' blue livery was not liked by all but certainly made a striking sight and prompted much discussion! 20142 and 20205 looked and sounded superb and generally worked as a pair, although 20205 was air brake only so had to be marshalled on the front of every train with 20142 providing the braking. This lead to some interesting runs with the 20s coupled cab to cab with bonnet leading out of Swanage!

It was easy to overlook the Cl.31 as it wasn't anywhere near as headline grabbing as some of the



other locos but, for me, it was exactly how I remember them on parcels trains through Chippenham and on the Pompey-Cardiff trains...work stained and a little tired looking but getting the job done. A trio of Cl.33s from the home fleet, one of each sub class, provided some interesting combinations. 33111 only ran on the Saturday and Sunday as it was fresh out of repaint.

The railway's two Cl.08s performed brake van rides at Norden on the Sunday, departing from Swanage with plenty of willing punters first thing in the morning. They then did runs between Norden and the River Frome (near the mainline connection) all day and returned similarly loaded in the evening. On the other days 08436 could be seen shunting around Swanage station.

The weather throughout the four days was excellent with rain overnight on the Saturday which threatened to linger into Sunday but cleared up by the time trains started running. Other than that, at Swanage at least, it was wall to wall sunshine. The annual Swanage Railway Diesel Gala is quite rightly getting a name for being an excellent, well run gala and this year was the best yet with record numbers over the four days. The organisers and many willing volunteers deserve a very well earned pat on the back.

This was the second year of ICRS co-sponsoring the Diesel Gala programme which helped to raise our profile and we did brisk sales across the four days on the sales stand at Swanage station. We met many Members and even signed up some new ones. Obviously, the weather helped greatly in bringing record numbers and the very impressive line-up was a big draw with two major firsts for the line. Colin James: I made a trip to the Swanage Railway for days 3 & 4 of their Diesel Gala. Both days were full of bright sunshine, hot in the sheltered areas away from the strong breeze. A good selection of locos were in use for the event. The Purbeck Mineral & Mining Museum next to Norden station was open, with demonstration runs taking place over their narrow gauge track. A beer festival was held in the yard area at Corfe Castle, with trade stands at Swanage station.

A typically intense and well observed timetable was in operation, using three rakes of mixed BR Mk1 and SR coaching stock. Two rakes of 5 coaches were on the all stations services, with 1 rake of 4 coaches on the limited stop service running out of the bay platform at Swanage. On the Saturday,

33201 was employed on driver experience runs on the northern extension from Norden. On Sunday the 08s, top and tailing two Queen Mary brake vans, were in use on the northern extension.

Andrew Buckley:

In the run up to this year's Swanage weekend I read somewhere of it being described as the 'Glastonbury of Diesel Galas', that made me stop and think. The line-up this year included a number of firsts. The first visit of a Cl.46, the first time a



Warship has ever operated on this line, the first run for CI.40 D213 since being withdrawn some thirty years ago and for that matter only the second time that I can think of a 40 ever having been on Dorset metals. This was also the first Diesel Gala that had seen Driver Experience on the northern section of the line from Norden Gates up to the River Frome Viaduct close to the NR boundary.

Friday and Saturday saw me on the line in time for kick off, with Friday starting at Corfe for the arrival of the five locomotive cavalcade from Swanage and Saturday seeing me taking in the scene at HQ itself with an array of locomotives ticking over that would surely have delighted any rail enthusiast, regardless of the year. Sunday saw a later start and a lineside position up on Corfe Common and a little further up the line by the second level crossing south of Corfe for as long as the sun would allow

at those points. The level crossing in particular is a favourite location for me on the line. The locomotives working the down services really open up as they climb away from Corfe and at this point you get to see and hear the power being applied, a real assault on the senses and absolutely fabulous.



I decided to get down for the opening of the Gala and was 3rd through the gate, which enabled me to get some great shots without any interlopers. Didcot always produces an excellent day out with a variety of locos. Unfortunately they were a few short due to unknown circumstances, which in fairness to them they reduced the entrance fee. Visiting locos were 56098 (UKRL) D182 (MRB) 33035 (BH) and D2120 (FHR) all running with 66118 and 08742 on static display. Home locos in action were D9516, 604 and DL16.





I was only there for the morning and they had D9516 on the first run up the short line and then attempted to add 56098 but had problems with breaking compatibilities, so the 56 had to be removed, a little later they paired 33035 and 56098 which I took the chance to ride behind before I left.

As usual the steam shed had a large collection of steam locos on display. There are many excellent photo opportunities. There was also a beer festival as well in a converted coach called the Black Python and a great variety of hot food. The event should attract more visitors than it gets as DRC has easy access, by rail and car and great facilities.

Severn Valley Rly (SVR) Diesel Gala, 19th- 21st May 2016 by Andrew Buckley:

Several members attended, what appears to a spectacular Diesel Gala, so photos are from several sources as shown (68025 is shown in **NEW STOCK**). The main report is by Andrew Buckley who had never visited the line before.

Ordinarily this is a Gala Weekend that takes place in the Autumn and clashes for me with other things. The move this year to mid May was an opportunity too good to be missed and therefore as soon as I saw the dates and indeed the depth of motive power rostered I booked a room in nearby Stourbridge. The added bonus there being the Parry People Carrier conveying me from Junction to Town...something I've yet to see, ed.

And so, in common with pretty much every Gala Weekend I have attended, the weather forecast was at best mixed and in particular Saturday carried a real threat of being a washout. Standing at Kidderminster on the Friday morning the skies looked threatening, but piercing the gloom were the English Electric whistle and rumble of a pair of Cl.20s and the Torpedo boat throb of a Deltic ticking over. I can't remember the last time I heard that combination but I would have happily stood in pouring rain listening to them.

Visiting: 20142/205 (MRB), 5580 (GCN), 33035 (BH), 37716 (DRS), D182 (MRB), D1010 (WSR), D9002 'King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry' (NRM), 55019 'Royal Highland Fusilier' (DPS), 66763 'Severn Valley Railway' (GBRf) which was named at the event, 68015/025 (DRS), 73951/952 (NR)



A quick look at the timetable decided my course of action with Deltic 55019 rostered on the 12.06 return working the first service for Bridgnorth. I therefore took the second working behind the resident D8059 + D8188 departing Kidderminster at 09.55. This would allow me time to have a look round Kidderminster itself and also give me an opportunity to quickly explore Bridgnorth before taking the Deltic back. As this was my first visit it would also afford me an opportunity to look for some vantage points from the train itself with a view to bailing from the 12.06 return.



Having made Bridgnorth and stopped for a 'nosebag' and a brief look around the rail environs there, I duly caught the 12.06 departure behind 55019 My destination was to be Highley and the Railway Museum on the Arley side with its picnic area and observation platform adjoining the museum itself.



On the journey back I was hanging out of the window thrilling to the sound of the Napier Deltic engine which seemed to be amplified in the relative stillness of the virtual amphitheatre that the surrounding landscape of mature trees and the stunning Severn Valley afforded. That section between Bridgnorth and Highley is, for me the most beautiful stretch line and the on the performance of the loco only enhanced it, what a noise!

Highley proved to be a good choice. The picnic area afforded the most magnificent sweeping shots of the line particularly the down workings for Bridgnorth. Plus of course having a cafeteria and locomotive museum on tap also meant that there was something to do all the time. After a great few hours at Highley I made my way back to Kidderminster on a staggered route taking in haulage by Western D1015 running in two disguises and a surprise, the second Deltic D9002, both of which performed and sounded faultless.

Saturday would follow a similar pattern but with the added benefit of a wander around the newly opened Kidderminster Diesel Depot. At Swanage I had had the opportunity to talk to one of the owners of a Cl.50 who work out of 'Kiddy' and he told me that the benefits were incalculable. The simplest being, with a roof over your head, working in the dry but also and because of this, the time benefits were staggering as you no longer needed to spend time at either end of your work session removing and replacing body panels. Simple!

So arriving at the depot it was great to see D1062 'Western Courier' along with Hymek D7029 inside but also an unnumbered and unnamed but exworks 50031 'Hood' in Intercity livery and the NR 73s. Also present was 66763.

So how to sum up. In excess of fifteen locos in operation over the weekend with others on the line so big ticks for me in terms of locos working, particularly as I'm a big fan of Deltics and Westerns. Stunning countryside through which

the line traverses, probably as beautiful as any preserved line I have visited and weather that intruded, but didn't overly affect.

LIGHT RAIL & METRO NEWS

Metrolink by Geoff Hope:

On the 30th April a member of the public slipped on the tracks close to Market Street stop bringing trams on the Piccadilly and Ashton services to a halt. Another power failure late morning on the 30th in St.Peter's Square disrupted services for just over an hour. On the 3rd May another incident occurred in

Oldham involving tram 3076 and a van. Reports suggest the van had passed a red light, the driver fleeing from the scene. On the 10th May a car finished up with a dented bumper near St.Peter's Square. No injuries were reported in either incidents.

St.Peter's Square will close from the 26th June for nine weeks for completion of the fourteen month rebuild of the stop. From this date the Eccles / Media City line will also close for track replacement. Services to Media City will recommence



at the beginning of August and to Eccles by the end of August to coincide with the opening of St.Peter's Square. The Cornbrook - Eccles section was laid in 2001 when the original Eccles service started. During closure of St.Peter's Square the following services will operate: Altrincham -



Deansgate Castlefield, East Didsbury - Deansgate Castlefield, Airport - Cornbrook, Media City - Deansgate Castlefield from the beginning of August, Bury - Ashton-under-Lyne, Bury - Ethiad Campus, Shaw & Crompton - Piccadilly, Rochdale - Exchange Square.

Trams 3001 (see photo above) & 3007 have both received Cadbury Crunchie advertising liveries, this is in addition to 3058 (see photo left) in Sainsbury's livery. Tram 3114 first day in service was on Wednesday 11th May. Tram 3115

arrived at Queens Road depot on the 7th May with 3116 expected on the 28th May.




PRESERVATION OUTPOSTS

Martin Eden visited Bath on the 23rd April and found a plinthed steam crane opposite the Holiday Inn Express on the Lower Bristol Road next to a Sainsbury's petrol station and a new housing development on the site of the old Stothert & Pitt works. The plaque is self explanatory but in addition it remained working up until it failed a boiler test in 2007. It was moved there on the 12th June 2011 from the S&Ds base at Washford on the West Somerset Rly. Cosmetically painted, it is hoped eventually to restore it to working order.

This is an original Stothert & Pitt crane (No. 312),
manufactured on this site around 1904.
It is one of the last remaining rail-mounted,

Driver Experience on the South Devon Railway by **Jeremy Frost**:

On the 15th May 2016 I attended a diesel driver experience day on the South Devon Railway, the day started with the five participants and their guests meeting on the platform at Buckfastleigh station at 08.30. After a safety brief for the day we started off by looking round the yard & sheds at Buckfastleigh. Leaving the station, we went down towards the yard where we saw Devon Diesel Society's 50002 which is currently undergoing restoration outside the Private Locomotive Owners Group shed. Following on round from this we saw South Devon Diesels Tractions Fleet, Cl.37 6975, Cl.25s D7612 & 25191 and finally Cl.33 D6501. After walking round the station side of the yard we went into the locomotive workshop for South Devon Railway Engineering, outside the shed was BR Cl.09 D3721 which was sporting BR Green Livery with an added GWR Logo also outside the workshops was South Devon Railways Cl.122 DMU W55000. The day continued with a visit to Buckfastleigh signal box, where we could also see the preparation of 6975 ready for our train.

10.00 soon came round which was the departure time of the first of our five trains for the day, On the first trip of the day we also had 0-6-0PT 6412 attached to the front of the train due to modified signalling arrangements using only one token (see photo below). Upon arrival at Staverton loop 6412 was detached ready to return to Buckfastleigh for the first service train of the day.





At 13.45 we stopped at Totnes Littlehempston, where I was allowed to assist in the uncoupling & coupling up of the locomotive to the train, after this we stopped for lunch and a presentation of certificates from our host for the day. Just before departure after lunch we were lucky enough to see 43002 pass by on the mainline on 1A87 Penzance to Paddington.

The day was rounded off by bringing the last train into Buckfastleigh at 17.05, throughout the day we had plenty of photo opportunities along the line, and all participants had a great day with the locomotive crew from South Devon Diesel Traction and all of the volunteers on board the train from the South Devon Railway Association.
