Ticket applications for our annual Members Only visit to Eastleigh Works are now open. Arrival at the main gate should be between 13.30 and 13.45 at the latest so that the safety briefing can be given prior to starting your visit at 14.00. Prior to the site being redeveloped for Crossrail, GWR is to host an event 'Legends of the GWR' to celebrate traction maintained at the depot.

There will be no tickets available on the gate. No children under 16 unless accompanied by an adult. There will be **no parking** available on site. They strongly advise using public transport as most spaces in local residential areas will be taken up by local residents. By rail either use Overground / Bakerloo Line to Willesden Jnct or Central Line to East Acton. Both are about a 10-15 min walk. Bus route 228 stops directly outside the depot entrance in Old Oak Common Lane. They are expecting two queues to form before the event opens. One will be going up the hill from East Acton, and the other will be going down the hill from Willesden Jnct. All profits will go to Place2Be, mental health support for children

PRESERVATION PHOTO SPOT – STEAM I

[2111] 0-4-0ST based at Midland Railway Butterley, recently returned to operation on the 27th April 2017 after a lengthy overhaul taking over 20 years. Built by Peckett & Sons in 1949, it was sold to J.Morriss who exhibited it in his Lytham St Anne's Motive Power Museum. It was sold on in 1994 to a member from Peak Rail and from there it moved to its current home and stored out of use until now. It is seen right in the West Shed, Swanwick on the 13th May with BR Std 2-6-4T 80080 under overhaul behind.

PRESERVATION NEWS

Midland Railway Butterley (MRB): Having not visited the MRB since January 2013 I managed to incorporate a visit in our trip south prior to the SVR Diesel Gala mainly hoping to catch the LT liveried Cl.20s. The 20s were obligingly present (see **LIVERIES**). Also not previously seen were footbridges at both Butterley and Swanwick Jnct stations, though the former was not fully in use. Though the main span was up at the latter, the footsteps had not been in place on my last visit.

On my previous visits most diesels used to occupy the tracks in front of the running shed adjacent the Matthew Kirtley Exhibition Hall at Swanwick Jnct. But with another twin track loco shed (see right) erected alongside the one put up a few years ago, most of the diesels are now to the east of the station and largely inside. Not so good if they are not open as was the case with the new



shed. I was told that it was occupied by Cl.31s. As can be seen the right hand track needs has yet to be connected. The 4 loco shed was occupied by D4, 20007, 20227 & 47401. Only 37190 and D1048 were in the yard with 47761 alongside the Exhibition Hall. Many of the MRBs diesel fleet is away at other sites.

Misc News: Regular services are to start between Swanage and Wareham over the northern extension north of Norden from the 13th June 2017 using Cl.33s & 37s courtesy of WCR in t&t formation with 4 Mk1 coaches. The service will operate on Tue-Thu, Sat & Sun departing Swanage at 10.23, 12.23, 14.23 & 16.23 returning at 11.15, 13.15, 15.15 & 17.15. Adult tickets are £15 day return or £9 single. National Railcards are not valid. The loco hauled services will run for the first year until the DMUs currently under refurbishment at Eastleigh Works are finished to complete the second year of this initial 2 year trial.

DMUs: CI.116 51131 is back in service on the Battlefield Line after being under repair since 2011. It is currently paired with its former partner 51321 which itself will be subject to repairs in due course.

Cl.101 51434 has been back in passenger use for the first time since in 8 years at the Mid Norfolk Railway.

JANUS LOCO

47205 / 47395:

Occasionally a loco painted / numbered / named differently on either side. One such loco with a split identity is D1855 renumbered 47205 / 47395 on the based Northampton & Lamport Railway, main base at Pitsford & Brampton. The photos right and below were taken on the 13th May 2017 showing one side / cab as 47205 in RfD twotone grey livery and the other in two-tone grey with 395 on the cab. Though



not shown here, both opposite cabs have a Tinsley rose depot plaque. Withdrawn in October 2001 it languished at Southampton Maritime Depot until moved to the NLR in December 2004

Having been discovered in bits in a Norfolk garden ex- Nidd Valley Light Railway built in 1916 by Hudswell Clarke [1208] is operational again after 60 years out of use. It was first named 'Mitchell' and worked at the Ministry of Munitions, Gretna Green during WW1. It was sold to Bradford Corporation in 1922 to work on the Nidd Valley Light Railway between Pateley Bridge and Lofthouse and up to the reservoir site at Scar House. It was renamed 'Illingworth' in 1930. When the line closed in 1936 it was sold to Sir Robert McAlpine Ltd. and renamed "Harold". It worked on the building of the Ebbw Vale



steelworks. It was then sold to Mowlems in 1940 and once again carried out war duties this time Swynnerton and Ruddington, taking the name 'Swynnerton'. In 1946 it worked on the Workington breakwater then Mowlem's Braehead power station before being consigned scrap Somehow the engine survived intact, spending half its life as a rusting hulk, passing through several owners but never on public display until

Stephen Middleton bought it and took it to Embsay & Bolton Abbey Railway around 2007. A lengthy restoration ensued and [1208] was finally steamed again during May 2017, making its preservation debut on the EMBs Branchline Weekend Event ass seen by Rod Johnson on the 28th May. The loco is named both 'Mitchell' & 'Illingworth' on either side. These were the first passenger-carrying trains which Illingworth had hauled for over 80 years!

Swanage Railway Diesel Gala, 5-7th May 2017 by Colin James:

The Swanage Railway held their 'Dawn of the Diesels' Gala over 3 days from Friday 5th to Sunday 7th May, with a preview day on Thursday 4th of May. I made the trip down to the railway for the Saturday & Sunday.

All trains ran to their booked diagrams with a well observed timetable. 3 sets of 5 carriages were in use, predominately BR Mk1s, with 2 SR Bullied carriages in one set and the Pullman Observation car in another. As the coaching stock is vacuum braked only, the air braked only locos 56096, 66741 & 73961 all worked their trains doubleheaded with a dual braked loco. The railway also offered prebooked driver experience turns on the Norden – River Frome bridge section of the line using 33111 on Saturday & D6515 on Sunday.



A good selection of trade stands were at Swanage station and a beer festival was held at Corfe Castle (which was doing a roaring trade). The trains were packed on Saturday, but looked a little quieter from the lineside on the Sunday. Another well organized event by the Swanage Railway.

Severn Valley Rly Spring Diesel Gala, 18th-20th May 2017 by Trevor Roots:

A fortuitous meeting with Roland Bull whilst visiting the diesel shed at Kidderminster on the way back from our AGM led to our attendance with our sales stand at their superb Spring Diesel / Mixed Traction Gala. The shed was open to the public on the weekend, Saturday, the last day of the Diesel Gala and Sunday, a Mixed Traction day. We were the only stand other than two model railways in the shed along with 7 locos and with persistent rain on the Saturday we were pleased to be inside, however that may have stopped some from making the trek. There was the added draw of a viewing area to see locos stabled or manoeuvring between diagrams. We had a reasonably busy Saturday selling numerous items including 45 books and enrolling 5 members on the day (more to follow). The Sunday was very slow with only a handful of books sold but it did allow a couple of visits around the yard to see the stabled diesels.



Having initially gone south to pick up more books Chris and I headed back up to the SVR via Eastleigh, as only round the corner from Minuteman at Botley, managing to sell 4 more Combines to the stalwarts on the station. We arrived late Friday afternoon at Kidderminster so I could at least catch some action and the last sun before thunderstorms arrived! The whole diesel gala was affected by indifferent weather with rain and sun from Thursday to Saturday but the rain stayed away on the Sunday.

With the amount of traction available. 27 working diesels and 3 steam (on Sunday), the permutations endless and workings operated singly, doubled headed or in top & tail mode using the 8 sets of coaching stock. The diesel traction consisted of 17 visiting locos of which 6 were from mainline companies and 10 from the resident fleet. The visiting air braked stock, especially the intercity liveried stock allowed a complete intercity liveried train using 47828 and 50031. There shuttle services

Kidderminster Town and Bewdley fitted in between services that traversed the entire route and at Highley there were brake van rides with the recently repainted industrial RH 0-4-0DM [319290] + toad 68501. In addition the working locos, there 10 static diesels. On the Sunday there were more static diesels as not all that worked from Thu – Sat were in operation, most being accumulated at the Kidderminster Diesel Depot.



My early arrival on the Friday was fortuitous as it transpired that was the last day that 88003 worked, remaining in the diesel shed for the weekend. So with skies darkening and a thunderstorm breaking over nearby Stourbridge I was at least able to see 88003 work in at 18.17 tailing 50031 and the IC liveried Mk2s. Not long after, it started to rain and became very gloomy but by then we were inside eating and listening for every new arrival so I could dash out for a photo.



60103 'Flying Scotsman' TRAVELS:

With 60103 'Flying Scotsman' travelling around the country to various preserved lines I thought a new section would pull the various reports and photos together.

Keighley & Worth Valley Railway by Mike Brook:

The iconic LNER A3 Pacific 60103 'Flying Scotsman' made its first foray of the 2017 season to the KWV for a period of 10 days from 31st March to 9th April. On the former date 60103 made a fully-booked return Charter (costing £220 per person) from Oxenhope to Carlisle to officially celebrate the re-opening of the Settle & Carlisle route, following the costly and successful completion of repairing the major landslip at Eden Bowes last winter.

1st & 2nd April were spent at Ingrow West Station on static display in light steam, where the general public were offered 'The Flying Scotsman Experience'. They could 'cab' it and walk through the tender for a reasonable fee. 3rd to 9th April featured varying numbers of return journeys (again all fully booked) starting at Howarth to Oxenhope to Keighley and back to Howarth, with the Locomotive always facing south and being banked by WD Austerity Class 8F 2-8-0 90733 to ensure that maximum axle weights on a number of bridges on the line were not exceeded. KWV also ran another loco throughout each day's operation to assist passengers getting to and from Howarth from other stations, and for non-Scotsman passengers.


Having collected my £25 specially printed hi-viz vest from Howarth (not an enjoyable experience as the volunteer Station Shop keeper had forgotten how to cope with entering my pre-paid receipt and had to call on the capabilities of other staff, who also had similar difficulties but got there in the end), I decided to visit on Wednesday 5th as 60103 was making 6 journeys rather than the normal 4, enabling me to maximise the photo opportunities of one visit, and also Saturday 8th, when it was scheduled to make 5 runs.



On the sunny 5th, I decided to shoot the southern end of the line and wanting to get some different shots in addition to those at the renowned KWV locations, I started out at 08.00 at Howarth and took some shots of it at the MPD, also featuring 90733 and Fowler MR 4F 0-6-0 43924 which was going to operate the non-Scotsman service. I then decided to head south and take each of them light-engine, exiting the MPD, using the Howarth Loop to access the main line and coupling up with the Carriages prior to commencement of the passenger services. As there was approximately 90 minutes between each journey, there was plenty of time to walk the line and so I then took photos at the renowned locations of Damens Signal Box, Oakworth Bank, Mytholmes Viaduct, Haworth signal box and 'The top field' (just north of Oxenhope) before deciding to call it a day at 16.45.

Saturday the 8th was cloudless and BR Std 4 4-6-0 75078 had been nominated to operate the non-Scotsman service. I decided to spend the day at the northern end of the line, featuring The Great Northern Straight, Bridge 4 at the top of Keighley Bank, Keighley Bank itself and finally at Keighley Station.

I was delighted that the 2 day visits resulted in getting some memorable shots, helped of course by the sunny weather and all trains running to time. What surprised me most of all was the lack of hi-viz vest lineside photographers, evidently more than 70 had paid the one-off £25 fee for the privilege of being able to access the line during this week, but I hardly saw any on both days. In view of previous experiences at other heritage lines visited by 60103, the KVW had clearly stated beforehand that the line would be regularly policed and any trespassers removed. I was checked once throughout the 2 days and saw no-one trespassing, despite there being lots of people photographing from land adjacent to the line!



Given the fully booked journeys and serious purchasing of the plethora of memorabilia and sustenance, cannot believe that Scotsman's visit was anything but a huge success in every respect. For the KWV, it must have provided a massive and most welcome financial boost. I was told by one of the MPD workforce that the extra funds are to be used in replacing the dilapidated MPD roof. It must also have attracted many people of all ages to visit the line who otherwise may not have done so. I spoke to a quite a number of visitors who rode behind Scotsman and the unanimous conclusion was that without any doubt whatsoever, it had proved to be a truly memorable. emotional and thoroughly enjoyable experience. Congratulations to the KWV for having the foresight and bottle to run such a major event and to the myriad of volunteers who helped in so many different ways to make it so successful. Long may this

total success be repeated at every other venue visited by this truly magnificent and iconic locomotive in the future.

Operating between Altrincham and Manchester London Road. now Piccadilly, the 81/2 mile route was electrified as 1500v DC overhead in 1931. Twenty two 3 car 1500v DC EMUs (later provisionally assigned Cl.505 by BR) were built in 1930 by Metropolitan Cammell Carriage & Wagon Co Ltd. The line was converted to 25kV AC in 1971 with the last of the Cl.505s operating on the 30th April. They were replaced by Cl.304 4 car EMUs.

Only three centre trailer Manchester South Altrincham Railway (MSJ&AR) CI.505 EMUs survived. 114 (29663) was preserved by the Midland Railway Trust after withdrawal by BR in 1972. The other two cars 117 (29666) & 121 (29670)were bought by the Altrincham Electric Railway Preservation Society (AERPS) and moved in 1972 to the Yorkshire Dales Railway, now the Embsay & Bolton Abbey Railway. After

initial use they could no longer be used in passenger service as they had no vacuum brakes and after gradually deteriorated in the open air they were moved to the Midland Railway Butterley (MRB) in 1983 to join 114. 117 & 121 were housed in the Matthew Kirtley Museum at Swanwick where ongoing restoration was slowly undertaken. In 2006 AERPS purchased 114 for spares and was then scrapped. In late 2012 it was decided to accelerate the restoration of 117 as sufficient funds were available and 117 was moved to the shed at Butterley. 117 is seen above under restoration at Butterley on the 13th May 2017. Strangely the associated info on the coach end is way out of date and still refers to 114 as being extant!!

LOCO PROFILE - CL.01/5


Only a handful of the Cl.01/5s are based on preserved lines, two of which have consecutive works numbers:

01583 is 1961 built 0-6-0DH Ruston & Hornsby 422 [459517] 'VALIANT'. Originally built for the MoD it was based at Caerwent from 1964 until sold to Knights Rail 02/10/07, moving first to Swanage

Railway before heading to Eastleigh on 14/01/08. It was used on an east London contract from 31/01/08 returning to Eastleigh 10/01/09. It was offered for sale and moved to the Lavender Line on 20/04/09.

right 4th June 2012 below 16th October 2010 Isfield, LAV





01585 is 1961 built 0-6-0DH Ruston & Hornsby 8217, 423 [459518]. Originally built for the MoD it was based at Bicester until sold in June 2003 to AVR then onto Wyvernrail in May 2004 then Ruddington, GCN in February 2005. Sold to Chiltern Rail it was moved to Long Marston for modifications then eventually to Wemblev from where it was sold in February 2016 moving via Aylesbury to Tyseley Loco Works at end of March 2016 then onto Quainton Road. BRC where it is seen below on the 18th April 2017. It was named 'Scaz' in 2010 but is currently nameless, having lost it when sold from Chiltern Rail. Earlier names carried have been 'Cromwell' and 'Churchill' though no details are known.



INFRASTRUCTURE NEWS

Hitachi, Newton Aycliffe: Further to the report on p15 in the August 2016 issue the following photos show the Hitachi facility at Newton Aycliffe, County Durham. Built adjacent the Darlington to Bishop Auckland line south of Heighington station, it opened in September 2015 when train production began. Having won the contract, it was developed to handle the replacement trains for HSTs primarily on the ECML (Virgin and Hull Trains) and GWML (GWR) under the Intercity Express Programme (IEP). Initial production focused on units delivered from Japan but full scale manufacturing of CI.800/801/802 EMUs is now in full swing with the sidings full of units, frustratingly not all identifiable. CI.385s for ScotRail are also to be built here, again following an initial run of 6 units from Japan.

Access is possible from an adjacent public footpath that starts at Long Tens Way about 200 yards south of its junction (roundabout) with the B6444 Heighington Lane, the junction being only 200 yards eat of Heighington station. The footpath crosses the railway south of the station via stiles either side from which I was lucky enough to catch one of the infrequent services operated by 142066 heading south to Saltburn at 18.19 on the 12th May 2017 (see opposite top).

The footpath then heads west skirting the banking which protects the eastern perimeter of the 31.5 acre site. From the top of the banking you get the view in the first photo opposite top. The footpath then runs adjacent the entire northern perimeter fence for about ½ mile from where all the units in the sidings can be viewed. Three tracks run into the works with 8 sidings on the northern side. A new lake has been created between the footpath and the B6444. Towards the end of the lake and about half along the fence there is a kink around three shorter sidings. The end of the site coincides with the footpath meeting a private farm track which heads back north about 300 yds to the B6444. There is nowhere to park safely on the road at this end.

As mentioned above only 2 units could be identified, 800301 from its window notices and 800009 which was numbered

New Stations:

A total of 12 new stations are under consideration in Wales of which 9 are brand new locations.

Cambridge North opened on the 21st May. The station is served by Greater Anglia services from Liverpool St and Greater Northern services from King's Cross.

LIGHT RAIL & METRO NEWS

Metrolink by Geoff Hope: On the 28th April a collision between a van and tram 3076 on the Airport line caused suspension of services for about one hour. Cutting equipment was used to free the van driver who was not seriously injured. On the 2nd May a Range Rover was left blocking tram lines on Mosley Street in the city centre, delays of a few minutes were incurred while passers-by pushed the vehicle out of the way. It was reported the vehicle had run out of fuel. On the 3rd May an individual was struck by a tram at Bowker Vale on the Bury line, services were suspended for approximately one hour. Late on Monday 8th May tram 3028 was attacked between Derker and Shaw by rock throwing youths from a footbridge smashing the windscreen causing face and chest injuries to the driver. After an emergency stop the driver took the tram to Shaw where the emergency services were waiting, the driver was taken to hospital having escaped serious injuries. Since this attack a high grille has been placed beneath the bridge to prevent missiles being thrown on tracks. On the evening of the 11th May, missile throwing youths were in action between Hollinwood and Failsworth breaking a window with the tram having to be taken out of service. Part of the new contract with Metrolink Keolis will be increasing security in the evenings and weekends. On the 11th May electrical cables caught fire close to Wythenshawe causing delays of three hours. On the afternoon of the 14th May the network was closed down due to a failure of the Old Trafford control room which lost visible sight and control of signalling systems so were unable to update the information displays at tram stops. The problem was fixed shortly after midnight ready for service the following morning. During May road closures and temporary one way systems were put in place to accommodate the preparation for the Trafford Park line.

No sooner had 3095 lost its advertisement for Raytheon Software Engineers it received an advertisement for the local radio station Key 103.3092.

Blackpool Transport: Balloon tram 718 returned to service on the 26th May.

Collett 2-6-2T 4150: Built 1947 and withdrawn in June 1965, 4150 ended up at Woodhams Bros Yard in South Wales from where she was rescued in 1974. Initially moved to the Dean Forest Railway it was then moved to the Severn Valley Railway in January 1978 to start restoration. However work

stalled in the 1980s and a renewed effort to finish the restoration was made in 2007

4150 was extricated from its protective tent and the boiler was removed in late March 2017 and put on a bolster ready to move to Bridgnorth boiler shop (see below). Side tanks, rear bunker and cab roof were fitted for the first time in many years and it was put back in its tent as seen right at Bewdley on the 9th April 2017. After 3 times as long out of service than it was in, it is hoped this ex-Barry loco, the last to be restored of the SVR fleet will be in service in 2018 for the

first time since withdrawal by BR.




RAILWAY GLOBETROTTERS

USA Canyons and Railroads by Ray Smith – Part 4 (final): Friday, 19th June 2015:

Today we visited the other private railway that was originally part of the Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad. This is the Cumbres & Toltec Scenic Railroad. Opened in 1970 as a tourist line is runs from Charma in New Mexico for the 64 mile journey to Antonito in Colorado. This is the highest and longest narrow gauge railroad in America. Amazingly this takes 6 hours 40 minutes although we stopped at Osier for lunch. There is one train in each direction daily and both pass at Osier.



Saturday, 20th June 2015:

Today we visited the Royal Gorge Route Railroad. This is also ex-Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad.



We joined the train at Canon City which is on the standard gauge line between Pueblo and Salida. The Royal Gorge Railroad purchased a 12 mile section of track from The Union Pacific in 1998. They began running services the following year. This 2 hour round trip runs alongside the Arkansas river below 1000 feet high granite cliffs, and under famous passing the suspension bridge. The line goes west as far as Parkdale although you cannot get off there. The train was top & tailed and we had class

RP40-2C C20 at one end (see below) and GP7, CRRX 2238 at the other but due to not being able to walk to the rear of our train the photo below was the nearest I could get to it. One thing that disappointed me was I could not walk up and down the platform. I had to queue at a gate adjacent to



our reserved coach and walk straight on to it. After the journey we took a coach to Colorado Springs for our last night in the USA. Arriving late afternoon our hotel was only a couple of minutes from the connecting line between Denver Trinidad. Wonderful I thought! I went down alongside the line and nothing came Union through! Pacific locomotive was stabled near the station and a plinthed steam locomotive nearby.

Sunday, 21st June 2015:

Our last day. We were on an evening flight from Denver to Heathrow so we had time to visit the Pikes Peak Cog Railway. Opened in 1889 it connected Manitou Springs, elevation 6,570ft with Pikes Peak, elevation 14,115ft. This line is open all year. Steam worked until 1955, the first diesel units came into service in 1938. The current fleet entered service from 1964. We left the warm sunny Manitou Springs and slowly climbed the eight and a half mile journey to the cool, partly snow covered Pikes Peak.



Our haul was 1976 built two car unit 19 (see left). After about an hour we returned back to Manitou Springs, joined our coach and continued to Denver for our flight to Heathrow. End of a wonderful tour.

NARROW GAUGE MATTERS

Welshpool & Llanfair Railway (WLR) by **Martin Evans:** I paid a visit to the WLR on 23rd May 2017 and found loco 823 '*The Countess*' in traffic for the day. At Llanfair Caereinion, locos 12 '*Joan*' and 822 were noted on shed. These are interesting times on the railway at present with many major improvements destined for Llanfair station resulting hopeful in a new loco shed and revamped facilities for visitors.

WAGON PHOTO SPOT

The first modern private owner steel wagons happen to be the first group of wagons in the **UK Wagons**. Just eight were built in 1974 by Procor, Wakefield, 3000-3007, they originally resembled BBA flat wagons with stanchions and high ends. Coded as PXA they were hired to Sheerness Steel,

Isle of Sheppey where the first four were re-built as **Bogie Scrap Open** wagons in 1981 to carry scrap to the works. The remaining four were re-built in 1985. All but 3000 were 300mm higher. They were re-coded JXA in 1990. They were transferred to other work in 1995 but on the 2nd February 1997 3 of the type were involved in a derailment on a viaduct near Bexley dumping hundreds of tons of material over premises below. Suspicion fell on the wagon type and 3002 was scrapped with 3003 & 3007 dumped as grounded bodies at Hoo Jnct.

Of the 3 wagons that still exist. **JXA** 3004 is seen in the West Yard, Doncaster on the 13th May 2017. The additional side sheeting can clearly be seen between the original ends. Note the unique design of ribs compared to the more normal vertical arrangement and the higher body of this wagon above the original ends. The end diagonal ribs do not appear on the lower 3000.




