

EASTLEIGH WORKS REPORT

by Carl Watson for the period 1st to the 30th September 2021

Locos: On 01/09 73965 had 'Des O'Brien' nameplates fitted and covered ready to be unveiled at the start of the GBRf 2021 tour (reported in last issue).

57303 and 57002 have arrived for a bogie swap.

66796 departed behind 66764 with its new HS2 livery and 'The Green Progressor' nameplates covered over for its unveiling at

Willesden Euroterminal on the 15th September 2021. Part of the event was to also reveal 'Jermaine' vinyl nameplates on 08703 after the lad who chose the name.

66796 is not operational and was returned to Longport for completion of its conversion before entering



above 66796 (hauled by 66764) now showing the HS2 livery passing Kidsgrove at 12.04 returning to EMD Longport from Willesden, 15th September 2021 (Lawrence McCormick) the branding on the sides states 'i'm replacing up to 76 lorries', 'IT'S CLEANER BY RAIL' (diagonal) and 'lightening the load on our roads'

RailAdventure 43480 and 43484 were towed to the East Yard for loading to lorries for onward movement to Immingham for ship to Cuxhaven and the continent. Since then, they have done a tour of Germany and The Netherlands and will be returning, probably later this month or early November.

Coaches: Mk3 40711, 41092, 41207 arrived from Ely for storage prior to moving to private sites in Morpeth.

Units: 769959 arrived for modifications in early September and 769943 departed after completion. 769930 departed on 1st October and was replaced by 769928.

360121 is now almost complete in EMR purple with a start made on 360107. Once these two are done the turnaround should be much quicker.

Wagons: IPA 2-car double decked wagons 23.87.4392.692-1/714-3 have received modifications for larger cars and been painted in CAT Groupe blue and are due to receive decals in early October ahead of release. These will then be followed by similar mods and repaints to 4-car double-deckers

Scrapped: 77386/410 (442405), 77405/29 (442424)

Cabs from 77386 and 77405 have been saved and sold on. This concludes the Cl.442 scrapping. The TS and TSW vehicles from 442405/07/12/24 are being kept for a potential future project along with DTS vehicles 77393, 77417 (442412) and 77388 (442407). All are owned by Arlington Fleet Services.

Underground: Scrapped - HW211/18. Next in line are HW209/10.

It seems the misreporting goes back to 2014 but begs the question as to why the DfT didn't spot the irregularities. The new name is to be SE Trains.

EMR: 180110 was seen running as a four car set whilst another of the ex-GA 170/2s has received the new corporate REGIONAL livery (see below).

make a **difference** BB@RADIO Devon **SET:** The ex-SWR CI.707s entered passenger service on the 27th September 2021, branded 'City Beam'.

SWR – Island Line: The Island Line is due to re-open on the 1st November 2021 using the new Cl.484 ex-D78 tube stock converted by Vivarail.

TfW: The three Mk4 sets with Cl.67 t&t DVT started operating on the 13th September 2021 between Cardiff and Holyhead

WCR: 47786 (AWCA) has been despatched to Burton for attention, being hauled south by 31128 from WCRC, Carnforth to Burton as 0Z31. 47786 has been out of circulation since early 2017

86401 made its debut on the 7^{th} October 2021 working the Northern Belle from Coventry to Preston before handing over to 4-6-2 60163 t&t 57601.

A new staff coach has entered service with the Northern Belle set using ex-CS 10703 which has received Pullman livery but not been named...yet. We saw it on our Carnforth visit but have had to wait for another member to photograph it in public, fortunately quite quickly, to illustrate it. The same applies to ex-ROG 47815 which has received BR two-tone green (see **LIVERIES**).

Colas: 43272 & 43274 have received Colas branding and operated their first test train on the 3rd October 2021, PLPR1 1Q18 10.30 Derby RTC - Darlington Down Sdgs, via Leeds, Carlisle and Newcastle.

Viramas Rail: This new company granted its safety certificate earlier in the year is looking to use Cl.319/321 EMUs for logistics traffic and potentially re-open former mail / freight terminals. An initial path has been secured for a Mossend – Birmingham service via the WCML. With the growing push to decarbonise coupled with fuel problems now more than ever is the time for these companies to pick up business and make the case to permanently move freight off roads.

CREWE BASFORD HALL VISIT

On the 2nd October 2021 and for the first time since October 2019, we were able to arrange a visit around the FL facility at Crewe Basford Hall. In the past we have been blessed with good and often warm weather, but the forecast was dire for this one. Friday had been glorious thankfully but having already started travelling down on the Thursday in appallingly wet weather the prospect of another wet day wasn't appealing especially when the object was to take continuous photographs for over an hour. Though Saturday started very overcast it was at least dry, so gave a chance early on to get photos of the LSL stock on Crewe Depot and stabled in the Horse Landing (see below). But by mid-morning the rain gradually started, so that by the time the remaining 52 members (some having cried off) booked on the visit assembled by the Yard entrance it was downright miserable though reduced to a drizzle. At least the new arrangement of meeting at 12.30 just off Gresty Lane worked much better administratively, though we were all a bit damp!!

Then our usual luck kicked in, for as we started our tour, this time from north to south, the rain stopped and held off literally until we were all trudging out onto Gresty Lane after another successful visit. We started around the rear of the Depot but had to wait whilst 66952 + 66561 shunted past us out of the yard then back in, so we didn't really begin the tour until 13.18. Our route took between a rake of new FFA Bogie Flats and one batch of stored Cl.86/6s and mostly JNAs / MLAs.

Once we reached the end of the Cl.86/6s we had a good clear view of the long stored 90050 + 86251 + stabled 47830 alongside the access road from the eastern side, not something we had before in previous visits.

Beyond the line of JNAs etc we were able to cross tracks heading for the disused Crewe Sorting Sidings South signal box and could look north down other tracks in the yard.

At this point 88005 entered the yard at 13.43 on the westernmost track alongside the access road. Continuing on we were able to individually view the second batch of Cl.86/6s stored beyond the signal box up to the A500 road bridge.

Crossing a bit further east into the yard, we then had a chance to view 90006 freshly outshopped in new

FL orange livery (13.52) (see right) and a quick chance to scan for further stock before leaving the yard via the footbridge. The last man off the footbridge being me at 14.02 desperately trying to grab as many photos as possible. Once out of the Yard onto the access road there was no rush to leave, allowing approx 20 mins to slowly record stock walking back down the access road.

Apart from the usual good mix of wagons, what was also impressive was the fact there were 47 locos scattered around the Yard including the 16 stored Cl.86/6s, with all but one now in two groups. Considering we didn't get to look in the Depot, which usually yields several locos, this is by far the most we have ever seen on any of our visits, there being only 26 on our last visit. A 48th loco arrived in the form of 88005 (see above). 66952 split from 66561 whilst we were walking round, appearing towards the southern end of the yard. Thanks to Tim our guide from FL for the chance to get close to and photograph all the Cl.86/6s, especially as the most 'southerly' loco, 86605, was Tony's last one.

Other than the many and various intermodal flats, the most identifiable wagons were JJAs of which all 40 could be seen and JNAs, of which 30 could be identified though there were many more.

The Stock List below was compiled from the 350 photos I managed to fire off. However, in particular I never had time to photograph between the JNAs on the left as we walked through the yard and I know other wagon numbers could be seen. It is surprising how easy it is to miss things when surrounded on

all sides and having to move along fairly quickly. So even taking photos continuously I missed some shots at the start like the PFAs, hidden behind two MHAs on lower tracks, next to the snowploughs (see opposite bottom) which I did photograph, then some stock which are on my wide-angle views but missed taking individually, even a couple of locos. The good thing about taking many photos is you can study them later at leisure to get the numbers...or see what you missed. I still wish though that I had had more time to zoom in on every line from the footbridge as that would have yielded more wagons.

We were lucky to be able to see 14 new FFA Bogie Flats out of 40 that had only arrived in the UK on the 28th September 2021, just missing 20 which left early Sat behind 66511. The other six were still in the yard though only two could be seen from the footbridge between 66952 and JJAs but the angle was too acute to get nos (see above). They were either 057/062/165 or 188, as the other two, 173/186 were

out of sight in the middle of a rake over towards the mainline with end wagons 640464/463 (north) & 83.70.4520.034-7/035-4 (south) (see below). This rake left on the 4^{th} for Felixstowe behind 66558 as did 165/188, with 6 others we saw (046/046/142/145/149/150) for Trafford Park behind 66516 + 66545.

All in all a good visit with 259 items of stock seen, nine more than on our last 2019 visit. The extra locos made up for the lesser number of wagons seen.

Crewe Station and Other Crewe Depots: Having arrived late afternoon in Crewe on the Friday, it was too gloomy to get any decent photos on the Station but along with Colin and Simon we headed out at 23.30 to get the CS Highlander sleeper from London Euston and a chance to cop a few more Mk5 coaches. I was also personally hoping to finally see a CS blue Cl.92 loco in charge, as the previous Crewe visits had yielded only the hired in FL 90046. That wasn't to be as it was GBRf liveried 92043, a photographic cop however, so a good second best.



As well as visiting FL Basford Hall Yard, the opportunity was taken to see what was on the DRS Gresty Bridge and Locomotive Services Depots.

On the Saturday morning, as mentioned above, the dry weather allowed photos to be taken of a fairly packed LSL Depot with 10 locos viewable including all four electrics, 86101, 87002, 90001/02, one of two each of the green Cl.37/47s in D6817 and D1944 along with 08483, one of the three depot shunters. Spares donor 47811 was also present. Though only 43046 and the top of 43058 was photographable, both the Midland Pullman and Staycation Express HST sets were stabled in the sidings. What was noticeable was the recently applied small yellow warning panel to both Midland Pullman power cars (see 43055 elsewhere). Along with 86101 and 87002 in the Horse Landing were ex-GA Mk3 HST coaches 41063, 42220, 42100, 44047 and 41117. Also seen was re-liveried Mk1 support coach 35461 now in SAPHOS STEAM red / cream and newly arrived Mk2 9513 on hire from ERS (see TRANSFERS).

DAYS OUT

Barrow Hill Roundhouse by Alan Jones:

As part of a four day "spotting fest" based around Doncaster, I decided that my first port of call would be the Barrow Hill Roundhouse Railway Museum near Chesterfield on the 29th August 2021. This was something I had wanted to do for a couple of years, but the pandemic had thwarted my efforts until now. So I aimed to make the most of it and hoped to get some decent photographs of the stored DRS CI.20 before the scrap man gets hold of them.

If you are driving on the M1 then southbound leave at Jnct 30 onto A616 eastbound then around the roundabout onto the A619 heading west over the M1 through Mastin Moor. After crossing over the A6192 (former railway line) turn right into Hall Road after 2½ miles at a small roundabout. Continue for ½ mile crossing a roundabout* then a railway line (traffic signal controlled bridge) before you turn next left after towards Barrow Hill (Station Road). After ½ mile and just before the T jnct, turn right into Campbell Drive and the entrance / car park is on the left. Northbound on the M1 turn off at Jnct 29A onto the A6192 for 2 miles passing under the A619 curving back left to the roundabout*.

Currently the museum is open at weekends with the entry fee £5 per adult, £3 (5-15) per child, or a

family ticket is £14 (2 adults and 3 children). This gives you access to all areas of the museum and the Deltic Preservation Society (DPS) working area when open, usually Saturday only. All other areas are off limits, although it is possible to view some of the stock at Harry Needle and Rampart Engineering (HN / RE). All area photography is allowed.

Walking up from the car park I was surprisingly greeted by 156909 parked up next to 85006 (see below) which has regained its former TOPS identity having been preserved as 85101 in the 'newly' re-



laid platform sidings (adjacent the brickworks). Superbly turned out Cl.02 D2868 was next to the café / shop entrance (see above), so I had a few photos in the bag before I had even paid the entrance fee!



Once inside the Roundhouse I found there were four main line steam engines parked around the turntable. As it turned out the stocklist on the museum website is a bit out of date, especially the diesel section as was the chalk board on the wall. Around the turntable were Director GCR 11F 4-4-0 506 'BUTLER-HENDERSON', Midland Compound 4-4-0 1000, J17 0-6-0 8217, GWR Prairie 2-6-2 5164, 0-6-0ST [3272] 'VULCAN,' 0-4-0ST [2491] 'HENRY' and 0-4-0ST 14 [1795] 'E.B.WILSON' with Cl.03 03066 + 0-4-0DM 3 [7922/DC2589] 'HARRY' on the turntable. The other side of the turntable area was cordoned off as a working area for the Baby Deltic project, along with a carriage that seemed to be the subject of a sledge hammer attack judging by the sounds that were emanating from the area. Also

present were a few industrial locos along with some information boards reporting the history of the building and locomotives.

Next, I made my way to the DPS building, spending a happy 20 minutes looking around 55009/15 and the cab of 55008 and soaking up the atmosphere, before making a donation to the coffers and also buying a mug. Still no substitute for a Western though!

Though I didn't know it at the time but there has been a sort out at BH with a number of shunters stored down the side of the DPS shed making them difficult to view let alone photograph now. Fortunately Stan Bown visited after Alan and managed to obtain the numbers by tacking onto a guided tour, ed.

First track by shed: 08943, KAA 96801, industrial 0-6-0DHs L127 [D1199] 'BILL' + L149 [D1200] 'BEN', [D1228], [10213], [5365], [612], second track 08742, 08782, 08824, 08798, 08428, 08786

I then made my way to the external yard viewing area on the coal stage and was surprised yet again by another sprinter in the shape of 156917 in the EMR servicing sidings with CI 20 D8107 'Jocelyn Fieldina 1940-2020' 89001 'Avocet' + 37607 in the HN / RE sidings beyond. The Cl.89 was hidden by a VDA 210382 making it impossible to get a decent shot, which was

one of the reasons I came here....often hard to get complete photos of stock in the HN / RE sidings but again Stan has been able to help out as 89001 now in the main yard (see elsewhere), ed.

The main yard on northern side of the viewing area contained the Cl.20s along with two 45060 'SHERWOOD FORESTER', 45115, 47769, 82006, E3035 and the boiler of Fowler Half cab 0-6-0T 41708, together with a few wagons and a recently restored PMV 1874.

Moving on to the storage line next to museum platform I spent a while photographing the various locos and stock lined up there (see below). Unfortunately, two of the electrics and the Cl.10 shunter were hidden behind 156909, with no angle to get a photo.

Barrow Hill is well worth a visit and is great value for the £5 entry fee with café and toilet facilities also getting a big tick in the book. Frustratingly to go along with the outdated loco listings on the website, a lot of the un-restored coaching stock and wagons were devoid of a number. A stock sheet for a small donation would be a good idea and could boost the museums funds, and would it be so hard to chalk a number onto a body panel?

I still came away more than happy with my visit, the atmosphere of the Roundhouse and variety of stock make it a great place to spend a couple of hours.

Misc News: Work has restarted on repairing Barmouth Viaduct after a busy summer season and will be closed until the 12th December 2021.

The first 440 metre double section of the East West Rail link Phase 2 near Bicester was commissioned on the 31st August between Gavray Jnct and Charbridge Lane and strategically will enable engineering trains to access the works site. This will allow the alternative route from Aylesbury to the HS2 terminal at Calvert to close with track to be lifted.

On the southwest coast the second phase of the Dawlish seawall and new promenade is taking shape adjacent Dawlish Station as seen below looking northeast by Paul Fuller on the 21st September 2021. Compare with photo of early construction on p53 in the June 2021 issue and how it used to be (bottom) on the 21st September 2008 (featuring 159101 and a demolished signal box), showing the lower promenade now filled in.

Hopefully Paul won't mind me mentioning that he is to undertake a prolonged period of treatment for his health, so we wish him well. ed.

Misc News: Delivered in October 2020 to Kirk Merrington Primary School, as reported on p53 in the November 2020 issue, pacer 142045 is seen on site on the 1st October 2021 (Map Ref NZ 26256 31033). The school is located 3 miles north of

Locomotion, Shildon and 1½ miles south of Spennymoor on the road east from Kirk Merrington to the A167. It can be easily seen from this road on the edge of the village and from an adjacent public footpath.



As mentioned above 4BIG 69335 formerly used as a Buffet in the bay platform at Leeming Bar (see opposite top) moved to Warcop, EDV in July 2021 as seen below on the 11th September 2021.



Also mentioned above BR Std 9F 2-10-0 92219, D8169 and GWR Fruit D 3461 are now based at The Sidings Ind Est, Tebay between the A685 and parallel M6, just south of Jnct 38 from which they can be seen. These two locos are becoming unwanted nomads with D8169 originally based at STR until May 2014 and 92219 at MRB until Oct 2012 then STR until Apr 2014.





Locomotion, Shildon: Several items of rolling stock have arrived during the pandemic 41001, 43102 and HTA 300001 or been repainted as with E5001 which featured on p58 in the July 2021 issue. Now in the workshop are DMSO 62517 from 306017 and 158A from MRB. Following withdrawal by EMR, its last operator, 43102 was donated by Porterbrook after being repainted into Intercity swallow livery and re-numbered from 43302. Along with 43159 it broke the diesel world speed record in November 1987, when it reached 148.5mph between Northallerton and York during a test run. With the NRM not renewing the operational loan of 41001 to the 125 Group and requiring repairs, it has been emasculated as a non-operational static display. With the aim to restore Cl.306 AC EMU 306017, which arrived in 2018 from loan at Chappel & Wakes Colne, EAR, DMSO 65217 is now in the workshop. Also in the Workshop area is Kirtley 2-4-0 156A, a national collection loco but has been on loan to the MRB since 1975 and is normally on display in the Matthew Kirtley Museum, Swanwick Jnct.






The event was also billed as the 60th birthday bash for D6729 as it entered traffic on the 3rd October 1961. It was due to be one of its last appearances, as it is due for a makeover from its now faded and care worn appearance.

Golden Ochre D9551, London Transport Maroon 20227, BR Green (small yellow panel) D6729 and BR Large Logo blue 47635 worked services over the full length of the line, single hauled between Ongar and North Weald, then top and tailed between North Weald and Epping Forest. These services utilized two rakes of mixed BR Mk1/Mk2 stock. One in blue / grey, the other mixed maroon and crimson and cream. D2170, which has recently been returned to BR Green with wasp ends and BR Swindon style numerals, worked brake van rides between North Weald and Epping Forest with shark brake van ZUV DB 993856. The BR green DMU, home based Cl.117 DMS 51384 and long term loanee Cl.121 DTS 56287, also worked North Weald to Epping Forest shuttles.

Other stock seen at North Weald were 31438 in BR blue, which was spare and the designated thunderbird locomotive for the weekend and 03119 in BR blue is stopped for an engine overhaul.

Another long term loanee, D8001 in all over BR green (courtesy of Cl.20 Locomotive Society) is stopped for a minor overhaul and repaint. 45132 in BR Blue is stopped for an overhaul. Cl.205 DEMU 205205 in NSE is stored pending bodywork repairs. London Underground 1959 Tube Stock DM 1031 is stored in the sidings. The railway's other Cl.117, DMBS 51342 is currently sheeted over in the sidings at Ongar.



'The Man of Kent' Newport – Battersea by **Nigel Benning:** Originally scheduled to run on the 3rd July 2021, Pathfinder Tours 'The Man of Kent' was postponed until the 15th September following the delay in easing Covid lockdown restrictions. The tour started from Newport (Gwent) at 05.40 and after picking up at Chepstow I joined at Lydney, my local station, departing on time at 06.16. Motive power for the diesel hauled legs of the tour was 67005 'Queen's Messenger', hauling stock 4991, 4946, 3149, 1813, 3121, 3146, 3123, 3119, 80042, 3147, 3110 and 35469. On departing Gloucester, our next pick up point, we came to an unexpected halt then after a short wait reversed back into the

station. It appears we had been 'wrong routed' and, once corrected, a second attempt was made at departing which saw us heading on to our next pick up points of Stonehouse, Stroud, Kemble, Swindon, Didcot Parkway and Reading.

Turning off the GWML at Acton, we headed via



Willesden West London Jnct. to Kensington Olympia, our penultimate pick up point. From here we then threaded our way via Latchmere, Longhedge and Stewarts Lane Jncts to Battersea Loop, arriving 41mins late. Here, 35028 'CLAN LINE' along with support coach Mk1 17096 reversed onto the rear of the train whilst 67005 was detached. Note that 35028 carried a commemorative headboard ANDY DAVIES 1941-2021, late Chief Engineer of the MNLPS. Departing here, although booked to run via Catford, we were instead diverted via Sydenham Hill to make up some time and we were just 17mins late leaving our final pick up point, Bromley South. A spirited run by 35028 along the north Kent coast saw arrival at Margate just 8mins late. Here passengers had a break of 2¾ hours whilst the loco and stock were serviced, which was plenty of time to look around the town and enjoy the seafront. Departure from Margate was on time at 15.20 and at Dover Priory we had a 12min operational stop. Next stopping

point was Paddock Wood, where 35028 took on water. Although booked to take 17mins this took longer, 26mins so departed late. Travelling via Orpington, it wasn't long before we reached our first set down point at Bromley South. From here we retraced our outward route, omitting the small diversion into Battersea Loop, arriving at Acton Terminal Complex at 19.37, just 4mins down on schedule. Here 35028 was replaced by 67005 and we departed at 20.12, now 10mins down. But a good run was enjoyed back to Lydney, which was reached at 23.15, 5mins early. A good trip.

TRAM, LIGHT RAIL & METRO NEWS

West Midlands Metro by **James Holloway:** A triangular junction is being installed at crossroads where Bull Street and Corporation Street intersect to connect the Midland Metro to the HS2 station at Curzon Street. The photo opposite top taken by James was on the 9th September 2021



Manchester Metrolink by Geoff Hope:

September 2021: The 'TRAMS BE AWARE' campaign seems to have little significance on the Ashton line at Audenshaw, as incidents occurred within metres of each other on three out of four days at the start of September. First a 10-year-old cyclist was seriously injured colliding with a tram on the 1st and there were two car v tram incidents on the 3rd and 4th. On the evening of the 11th September a fire broke out at the Deansgate / Castlefield stop at one of the nightspots situated beneath the platform and took approx 2 hours to control. Late on the evening of the 11th September a man fell between the couplings on a double tram at Exchange Square, resulting in the amputation of his leg. Over the 13-19th September the SCC was closed whilst further trackwork were carried out at Victoria affecting services to Rochdale / Shaw calling at Market Street / Shudehill on the FCC.

Passenger numbers have reached 50% of pre Covid levels with weekends seeing between 60-70% increase as leisure travel is becoming more popular. The return of schools during September is likely to further increase numbers. KeolisAmey are looking for the extra capacity targeting 52 million passengers by the end of 2022 utilising the, by then, full fleet of 147 trams. On the 8th September on one of the hottest days in Manchester in 2021 the Metrolink Network was suffering with faulty trams across all



routes. The DoT has agreed to fund a viability study to bring Metrolink to Bolton, using the Bolton to Bury disused railway track bed.

Trams 3070 / 3095 / 3102 have lost the advertisements for Soccer Aid / Manchester Pride / Welcome back to Manchester respectively.

Tram 3069 is now advertising IKEA furniture as seen left at Parkway on a Trafford Centre - Cornbrook service on the 14th September 2021. A deal has been agreed between Lifebuoy Soap, the world's number 1 hygiene

soap and Transport for Greater Manchester, to provide tram / bus users with free hand sanitiser at Interchanges across the network. Hence tram 3117 is now advertising Lifebuoy soap as seen below at St Peters Square advertising Lifebuoy on Airport - Victoria service on the 17th September 2021.



Tram 3129, the latest arrival on the 7th August 2021, has been commissioned and was reported on the Eccles / Ashton service on the 29th August, 22 days after arriving at Queens Road depot. Trams 3130 and 3131 arrived on the 11th and 25th September respectively at Queens Road Depot for commissioning and mileage accumulation.
