Editor's Comments: Firstly apologies for the late arrival of the last issue, as although I got it to the printers on the 6th April prior to departing south for AGM etc, they have suffered badly with Covid so production was severely delayed. This month is also a week later than planned, because after holding out mostly hidden away from people in deepest Scotland for two years, both myself and Chris succumbed to Covid, picked up in Crewe. My comments in the last issue on Covid seem prophetic now, but I wasn't expecting it would be us that got caught, as did Gareth our Social Media guru (plus his Mom subsequently) and Colin, the first to become positive on the Sat night. The three events over the weekend were affected by Covid in that several other members were forced to cancel. Fortunately. I only started feeling ill on the journey back late Monday but it floored me for three weeks so don't tell me it's only mild. Thankfully Mom did not get infected, but just to be contrary instead contracted another UTI spending Easter in hospital, so at least away from us and taking the pressure off Chris...it's all been happening here!! The consequence of getting Covid meant I did not feel like editing May **TRACKS** until the end of April or answering hundreds of emails so catching up on them took time, though most relate to **TRACKS** contributions.

Covid aside, the AGM weekend proved to be successful with good weather for the Basford Hall visit, AGM and visit to Briddon, reports elsewhere. The delay also means that our latest successful visit to Goodmans Yard, Wishaw, though one I couldn't attend as too busy, has also come and gone. The next visits are towards the end of June to Carnforth and Basford Hall, again neither of which I can attend due to family commitments....they have to come first sometimes. Details on the KWV visit in August have also now been finalised.

What with several of our own visits, a plethora of preservation Galas and rail tours means I have yet again got too much news and not enough pages. In fact this is the hardest job I have had in paring down the pages, Even dropping articles to the next issue I was still 12 pages over so several reports already written will be held over until the June issue including Wishaw. One article I was intending to write but didn't have time will cover the upgrade at BKR / SRPS Museum, Bo'ness. The only consolation is I intend to get the June issue to the printers in early June before the Jubilee bank holiday. This will also cut down the topical news and means you will only have 3 weeks to wait.

The scrapping of older EMU classes has now reached the point that GA Cl.317/7 is no more, other than those awaiting their fate in Eastleigh Works and the only cars left from Cl.365 are three in preservation (EKR) and one (from 365526) languishing at Wolverton Works. With the start of May came the first scrappings of SR Cl.455/8s, six already, their seats hardly cooled down from the last passengers!! Meanwhile the scrapping of 4w wagons is continuing at pace with 171 dealt with in the last three months, particularly MHA / MTA Open Boxes.

Over the past few weeks, the railways in Ukraine have suffered more attacks from Russia with several substations hit in an attempt to knock out the electrified system.

I have to say I despair at times of the UK rail industry. With its growth and sustainability needed more than ever it is about to commit hari-kari...again. The unions are threatening national rail strikes because they can't be given guarantees on job security and pay. Having been heavily financially supported by the Treasury, who have no real understanding of railways and with the devastation and structural changes wrought by the pandemic yet to be fully tackled or understood, major price upheaval in the energy market and a war affecting everything, how can such guarantees be given. If they go ahead, I would like to ask how they think that is safeguarding their industry or the public and will they live with the almost inevitable accidents / deaths that will occur due to passengers forced to use roads, a much less safe form of transport. I also think they have totally missed the changing travel patterns and that they are erroneously banking on a traditional strike that only largely affected long suffering commuters who had no choice. But strikes, particularly at weekends, will now affect the booming leisure market and potentially put off new passengers as commuters can now easily switch to home working. It is a very difficult time ahead and by all means fight for members rights, but not with strikes, a very blunt and harmful tactic which will only play into the hands of those who want to reduce the network.

The good news is that the DRS Open Day is back (see **EVENTS**). I must have missed the advertising but it looks like guided tours have been sold for Bristol St Philips Marsh Depot. Hopefully some of you went and if so, did you take any photos?

Visit Payments: Payment is cash on the day, please try to bring exact cash.

General Booking Conditions: Unless shown otherwise all visits are unlimited. Where limited places the number left is shown in brackets

Bookings should be made to either Tony Whitehead or Christine Field as stated (if you phone / text Chris you will most likely though get Trevor). Contact details are on p2. Clearly state your name, membership number, and importantly a contact telephone number. If it is for an event with multiple dates eg Carnforth then indicate your preference / availability for the dates shown. Email is best for Tony and he will respond asap. If telephoning Tony please do not call after 20.45 in the evening, as he will be in bed early as he has to be up for work at 04.30 each morning. Best time to ring is after 18.30 weekdays

and weekends. Though Tony does not have an answerphone he will return your tel. call promptly if your number is recorded as a missed call, so don't panic. Only if you consistently have any trouble contacting Tony or he hasn't responded after several days then in the last resort contact Christine / Trevor. Note we cannot accept bookings by letter only, as there is no way to quickly contact you if plans are amended at short notice.

Please note no booking / confirmation will be taken if you do not provide full details. As volunteers, neither Tony, Chris or anyone else should have to chase you up if you fail to provide details. It is seconds of your time to get it right but can lead to wasted hours of ours chasing you up if you do not comply. Checking the membership database doesn't always help as it also seems we then find members have not told us about changed telephone numbers or email addresses.

Delay in travelling notwithstanding, please note that there is no excuse for booking then not notifying us you cannot then attend. As with events where numbers need to be accurately known by the hosts for a tour, food or room capacity this is not acceptable. We have tried to ease the official's organising burden and saving you money in postage by allowing members to pay on the day, but this can be abused as it can be then seen as nothing to lose if you can't be bothered to turn up. It may also prevent your place being offered to someone else. Conversely where numbers permit, we will allow applications right up to the day to be as flexible as possible but do this by phone only as officials will be travelling to the event.

Clothing: As shown alongside each visit. Stocks of Hi-viz and bump caps can be bought from Trevor.

Pandemic / Hygiene: It is not the time for everyone to get blasé about Covid19 and assume it is ok to catch it. No-one knows the effects the virus can have on individuals and as the average age of members is 65, we are more vulnerable. Many members have underlying health issues and to feel safe we insist that all visit participants must be fully vaccinated up to whatever the current government guidelines state, currently three jabs. For the foreseeable future also please remember to bring a mask as we may be asked to wear them and some may feel safer anyway doing so regardless of guidelines, which still vary throughout the UK. Good idea to bring hand sanitiser as well.

IMPORTANT If you feel unwell and it could be Covid do not attend and put others at risk.

Members Only Visits

West Coast Railways, Carnforth - Various 2022: Booking CLOSED Reserve lists in operation. Cost £25.

Sat 18th Jun (FULL), Sat 6th Aug (FULL), Sat 8th Oct (FULL)

Places are limited to a max of 30 per visit (min 20)

The tour will take approx. 3 to 3½ hours so if you are travelling by train please arrange your return accordingly. Needing to leave early can cause problems and we don't want to risk future visits. Entry will be at the main access off Jesson Way (Postcode: LA5 9UR, OS Grid Ref: SD 49128 70057) via the A6 and Crag Bank (mini-roundabout), this is the first bridge over the WCML 1.25 miles south of the station. Start: 10.30 so meet no later than 10.00 at the station (Postcode: LA5 9TR, OS Map Ref: SD 49713 70649) where fee will be taken and clothing bought if required. Those who have arrived by train will be ferried down to the entrance. It is a big site especially when you have gone up and down the various lines, requiring stepping over numerous tracks. Therefore, due to the terrain, distance and pace this visit is not advisable for anyone with mobility problems. However should anyone with mobility problems wish to go then transport can be provided within the site to access the main sheds where most of the locos can be seen. Hi-viz jacket / vest, sturdy footwear and hard hat / bump cap required. All photos taken are for private use ONLY, no public display either online, in magazines or via social media.

FL Crewe Basford Hall Yard - Sun 26th Jun (with another date TBC) Apply to Tony

Places unlimited (currently 50 attending). Cost £15. Sunday has been chosen as this may allow wider access to the Yard during a NR possession, which means there will be no through movements. The 1 hour trip around Basford Hall Yard starts at 12.00 (meet no later than 11.45) from the main gate just off Gresty Road (Postcode: CW2 5AA, OS Map Ref: SJ 70989 53756) ¾ mile from the station. On foot turn left from the main station entrance onto Nantwich Road then first left onto Gresty Road, pass Crewe Alexandra FC then left after ½ mile under the railway bridge opposite DRS Gresty Bridge Depot. Hi-viz jacket / vest required.

Scunthorpe Steelworks / Appleby Frodingham Rly (AFP) - Sun 10th Jul 2022: Booking CLOSED Max 40 (FULL). Cost £15. Arrive 09.45 for 10.00 start. Duration 6 hours in 4 brake vans hauled by diesel, six people max per verandah. Tour starts from the ARP Frodingham platform alongside A1029 Brigg Road, Gate E, where parking is available (Postcode: DN16 1BP, OS Map Ref: SE 90606 10946). Scunthorpe Station is ¾ mile to the west. Visit to preservation shed included where refreshments will be available. Hi-viz not required.

Eastleigh Works - Sat 10th Sep 2022: Apply to Christine

Places unlimited though there is a nominal max of 200 (currently 193 attending). Cost £20. The Works is ½ mile south of the station via A335 Southampton Road which runs adjacent the railway (10-15 min walk). Access is via new main gate off Campbell Road opposite NR building, which is beyond where the lefthand footpath starts. (Postcode: SO50 5AD, OS Map Ref: SU 45661 18367). Only disabled car parking on site but the Swan Centre multi-storey car park is between the station and Campbell Road (Postcode: SO50 5PB). On-street parking may be available but restrictions apply. Please arrive by 13.30 at the latest so that you can be let in, pay your money then gather for the safety briefing, prior to starting your visit at 14.00. It is possible we may be able to start the visit earlier so allow for this in your travel arrangements. The fee covers the normal Arlington visit fee (which they donate to charity) and organising stewards. You will get access to all areas until 16.30 and cab rides...locos TBC. Hi-viz jacket / vest required. It is a deceptively big site, especially when you have gone up and down the various lines and inside Works roads so be prepared to walk. The Works canteen will be open to purchase refreshments.

Keighley & Worth Valley Rly (KWV) - Fri 19th Aug: Apply to Christine

Max (30). Cost £10. Tour of Haworth Shed / Workshop. Arrive at Haworth 11.45 for 12.00 start (Postcode: BD22 8NJ, OS Map Ref: SE 03476 37221) Other facilities to visit on the line are the free Museum at Oxenhope holding stock awaiting overhaul and Rail Story, two Museums at Ingrow West namely The Engine Shed (Bahamas Loco Society) and Carriage Shed (vintage Carriages Trust). Cost of the Rail Story museums is Adults - £5 and Concessions - £4. There is free car parking at Oxenhope, Ingrow West with a £3 charge at Howarth. There is P&D car parking at Keighley but not advisable as shared with mainline station so busy. If you book a rover ticket in advance you get free entry to the museums, Adult - £17, Concessions - £14.45. We have left it up to you how you visit the various facilities other than the shed as it was impossible to work out an easy route round by booking a train as on a Fri there are only four round services. If you are travelling by train then the first KWV service from Keighley is at 10.50 arriving into Haworth at 11.10. If you are coming by car but then book a rover you can park at Oxenhope and there are two trains to Haworth before 12.00, 10.00 (arr 10.06) and 11.40 (arr 11.46)

Max 20 (FULL) Reserve list in operation. Start 10.00, duration 3 hours. Meet 09.15 at Bury Bolton Street Station (Postcode: BL9 0EY, Map Ref: SD 80254 10813). Pay & Display car parking available around station. Bury Metrolink stop 5 min walk. This is oversubscribed as it is the only visit allowed by ELR in 2022. We will apply for further visits in 2023. Cost & timings to be notified to attendees. Hi-viz jacket / vest required.

EASTLEIGH WORKS REPORT



Locos: 66708 departed in GBRf livery with large Ukraine flag on bodyside (see cover of last issue), returning on 04/05 to have Ukrainian Railways logos added.

69005 arrived for repainting behind 69001 on 07/04 and was released in BR green with cream windows and stripe and named *Eastleigh* on 29/04 (see below).



50021 was started for the first time in over 20 years on 10/04. Unfortunately, a UAT issue meant it wouldn't be able to go to Swanage for the gala in May.



66848 arrived on 20/04 for minor collision damage having hit a tree. 66734 (2nd iteration of number) has arrived for repainting as seen below on 29/04 having had its green vinyls removed.

43047 was almost complete in Midland Pullman livery on 04/05 (see right).

360116 arrived behind 47739 on 07/04 (see left) with the same loco taking away repainted 360101 the same day (see below).

360116 was almost complete by early May.



Scrapped: The remainder of 317723 (71599/77070) has been scrapped with 77079/71608 from 317732

Wagons: IPA 23.87.4375.046-1 has been converted with 029-7 undergoing conversion.

FEA-S Slinger Flat 640931/36-43 have been returned to standard FEAs with the removal of all the extra frames / cranes / generators and are being overhauled for use as intermodal wagons.





LHCS: Generator 6313 has had some repairs and a partial repaint as well as new Belmond logos added. Riviera's Mk1 RBR 1671 is prepped and ready for a repaint in BR blue / grey.

On 03/05 37688 t&t 43059 arrived with Mk3 TF 41182 for CET fitting + Mk1 FK 13227 as a barrier (see below). 37688 departed with 13227 and CET fitted Mk3 TF 41169 on 04/05.



GRAFFITI / VANDALISM

The major clean-up to remove graffiti so far costing £2 million has resulted in 450 sites being cleared in Kent, Sussex, Wessex, London, West Midlands, North East and North West. It is interesting to note that since three people were arrested for 80 instances of graffiti in the Crayford area of South East London, no further attacks have occurred.

FL CREWE BASFORD HALL YARD VISIT

As part of our AGM weekend, we arranged a visit around the FL facility at Crewe Basford Hall Yard. As has often been the case we were blessed with good weather though the parking turned out to be a nightmare. Another visit had been added prior to our own with no gap in between and the access road was being repaired, so half the parking was removed anyway. None of this was known about so no warnings could be given and until just before we started our car with all the books etc had to be parked several hundred yards away...not ideal or conducive to my demeanor!!





Because of the overlap in groups our start was delayed until 12.10 and unlike last time the 77 members who attended were this time taken along the access road before crossing the footbridge into the yard then returning through the yard and out behind the Depot. This isn't as ideal as the other way round.

Though there was the usual good mix of wagons (26 types) the initial loco count appeared quite low as most of the operational locos, 12 were near the Depot with 4 of them inside. As has unfortunately been the case in recent times we were not allowed to view these from the front. The resident Cl.08 shunter was freshly liveried / overhauled 08891, having recently moved from LHG, but was unphotographable largely hidden by the fuelling point, as was an unidentifiable FL Cl.66 (see right). A further 17 stored electrics were on site though the 8 Cl.86/6s near the A500 road over



bridge at the southern end of the yard could not this time be visited as they were blocked in by autoballasters, so could only be viewed from afar. There were also two stored DRS Cl.37s in the Coal Yard. Two rakes of TPE Mk5s were also visible in Crewe South Yard though unidentifiable.

During the visit three freights entered the yard so providing another 68 wagons and 5 locos, as the last was triple headed. This bumped the loco count up to just two less and the wagons to 50 more than on our last visit in October 2021. It also meant that of the 13 ex-GA Cl.90s, 7 were seen.

The most seen wagons were **JNAs** and **MHA/MPAs** of which 36 and 27 could be identified respectively, though there were many more. It was also interesting to see how the new **FFA** wagons are now being used interspersed in consists and nice to see a couple of the yellow WASCOSA **MLA**s also present.

For the event 4079 was joined by namesake the other *PENDENNIS CASTLE*, 57604 as seen below by Colin James.




AGM REPORT



Suffice to say an early breakfast was taken and setting out at 08.30 we did in fact arrive by 09.45 with traffic light at the time.

Peter and Andrew Briddon had done a great job in moving all the stock into viewable / photographable positions and removing tarpaulins. Not all will appreciate that this is no mean feat, easier getting them off than back on !!. A handy stock list was provided showing where stock was positioned, though some



had moved as was stated as may happen on the sheet. It is a very constricted site east of the B5057 with three short tracks sandwiched between the Peak Rail running line and a public footpath, so every inch of space is used with parts of all descriptions surrounding the stock.

It is over six years since I last wrote an in-depth



Pete and Andrew Briddon are not only accomplished engineers but enthusiasts and as Pete points out "there are other hobbies that take less time and money" and although working in railway engineering since 1978, he only got there because he was an enthusiast. Andrew spent six years with Porterbrook and is now Fleet Engineer for a TOC with stints at Colas Rail and Siemens in between. Pete undertakes work on other people's locos, and from time to time borrows Andrew's locos to be able to provide a full service. This means that as well as locos from the collection there are always other locos on site so on our visit there were 25 present plus a TRAMM, a 4wDHR and dismantled Wickham Trolley. Some locos from the collection were off site at other locations.







During our visit Peak Rail were operating past the site with recently restored Prairie 2-6-2T 5553 (see opposite top), which we were able to gain a unique view of thanks to Peter.

Following just over an hour of looking at the locos, cab rides were given in both RS8 and the TRAMM. I didn't partake in these as had to leave but I gather these were enjoyed by all. RS8 proved to be a bit problematic, read Pete's blog for more details.

An interesting working on the 15th April saw the TRAMM move [486] to Rowsley returning with HNRC

owned HE 0-4-0DH [7161] (having been brought from Long Marston on the 1st April). The latter is to be stripped for parts. YEC 0-6-0DH [2895] *EARL OF STRAFFORD* has also arrived from Elsecar for restoration to running order and is now part of the collection. [10180] is soon to be works shunter at Rowsley for PEA.

FRANCHISE / NETWORK NEWS

One national incentive to get people back on trains, which incidentally passed me by, was the Great British Rail Sale launched on the 19th April 2022 promoting half-price off-peak single tickets for travel between 25th April and 27th May though they had to booked by the 2nd May 2022. However, the scheme received mixed reviews as apparently it wasn't easy to find tickets or made clear what the tickets were to start with. As with many promotions it didn't mean these tickets were the cheapest. Still anything which promotes rail travel is better than nothing. ScotRail didn't participate but is to introduce its own much simpler scheme, with tickets available between the 9-15th May 2022.

AWC: As reported in the last issue the first refurbished Pendolino 390125 entered service on the 25th April 2022. This has included converting car G from first to second class. It was under overhaul for 30 weeks whilst the method of refurbishment was evaluated but time to handle subsequent sets will eventually fall to a two week turnaround from the fifth set, 390156. The second to fourth refurbished sets currently undergoing exams prior to re-entering service are, in order, 390123/148/155. The 11 car sets are being dealt with first ahead of the 9 car sets, the latter probably taking less time to complete as shorter and no car G to convert.

390129 has gained an additional cab front name, *Brett*, in honour of Brett Hobson a duty controller who died aged 41 from cancer.

Crossrail: A day long overdue, 3½ years in fact, but finally the Elizabeth Line (Crossrail) is to publicly open on the 24th May 2022 with 12 trains per hour between Abbey Wood and London Paddington between 06.30-23.00 Mon-Sat. Bond Street however is not yet complete so will not open until later in the year. The existing London Paddington – Heathrow and Liverpool Street – Shenfield will continue to operate separately for now but rebranded Elizabeth Line. Full through workings will start in May 2023.



c2c: 720601-04 the first four of six new Cl.720/6s have been delivered.

left 720603 hauled by 37510 (see STOCK MOVES) on 06.40 Derby Litchurch Lane - East Ham, Caledonian Road & Barnsbury (11.40) 21st April 2022 (Eric Salisbury)

CS: 67023 formerly operated by Colas Rail debuted on the CS on the 8th April 2022 with 73966 between Edinburgh Waverley and Inverness.

GWR: Having gone to the trouble of continuing to give HST castle set power cars new names, it now looks like the fleet will be reduced to save costs. The likely sets to be stored are those owned by Angel Trains. Even the 19 tri-mode CI.769s may also never see service with GWR. Watch this space.

TfW: New Cl.196/197 sets currently stored at Donnington Railfreight Terminal, Telford are 196002/113, 197006-09/12/14/17/19/20, 197103

WMT: With services reduced, four of the thirteen Cl.319s with WMT are now off lease and have been stored at Nemesis Rail. 319013/216/218/460, moving there on the 22nd and 23rd March 2022.

Eurostar: First announced in September 2019 Eurostar and Thalys have finally merged having gained approval from the European Commission.

Vivarail: A second Cl.230, 230011, has been exported to the USA for the Railroad Development Corp. This is clearly a newly converted unit but its D78 donor cars have yet to be identified.

GA: With the Cl.317/7s now gone there are just 17 operational Cl.317s left. The last six stored non-PRM modified Cl.321s have all moved to Worksop, possibly for a new life.

720105 the first Cl.720/1 has been delivered and has quickly entered service

LNER: The last remaining Cl.91 to receive a major overhaul, 91114, returned to service on the 16th March 2022.

801203 damaged in the level crossing collision at Rossington in September 2021 has returned to service.

NO: Having sustained cab roof damage in a tree strike near Chester during Storm Arwen in November 2021, 150124 has been repaired at Wolverton and returned to Newton Heath on the 11th April 2022, as seen right passing Stafford at 10.12 by Tony Gaze





150006 has gained the name Glen Hopkins on the cab front in honour of a long serving driver based at Manchester Victoria who has just retired. Seen left at Castleton at 09.53 by Harold Hull on the 5th May 2022.

ScotRail: On the 1st April 2022 ScotRail moved from Abellio

into the public sector and is now operated by the Scottish Government as 'an operator of last resort'

DRS: Recently stored 37038/059/259/409, 57003/07 have all been offered for sale, further depleting the ranks of heritage locos.

The five Cl.57/3s hired to ROG came to an end on the 31st March 2022 with 57301/03 sored at ZA and CG respectively) and 57305/10/12 returned to DRS. 57305/12 are in ROG livery.

With the exception of the flask escort coaches, DRS no longer owns any other Mk2 coaches / DBSOs with all moved to other users or scrapped in the case of DVTs.

GBRf: In partnership with Beacon Rail, 30 Cl.99 Bi-Mode Co-Co 25kv / Diesel locos are to be built by Stadler. Similar to EURODUAL locos operating in Europe, these locos are due in service in 2025.

HNRC: Ex-DRS 37603/04/09 finally made their way to Worksop from store at MoD Longtown, having first travelled south via Crewe with LSL bound 57004 on the 21st April 2022.

WCR: Three Mk2s moved to Assenta Rail, Hamilton on the 30th March 2022 for the fitting of retention toilets, 6000, 6528, 99675



TECHNOLOGY NEWS




Not illustrated before is 321334 the one EMU so far converted by Eversholt for the Swift Express Parcels service. It is stored in the former Royal Mail Terminal in Doncaster Decoy Yard Seen as below on the 10th April 2022.

A new type of OHL mast has been developed under the 'First of a Kind' imitative. Made composite from materials it is 20% the weight of an existing galvanised steel mast. Clearly there are cost and energy efficiency advantages in a lighter mast in terms of transportation and erection but it also allows the move away from carbon intensive manufacture. Maintenance will also be easier with embedded smart sensors allowing remote monitoring. With electrification likely to be forthcoming this could be very helpful.

Following the cracking issues on Cl800 series trains and the

subsequent checks made on similar Cl.385/395, there have been intensive efforts to understand and develop an effective repair. Hitachi is to start a major six year repair programme involving all 1247 Cl.800 series carriages and 487 Cl.395/385 centred on Eastleigh Works

On the 9th it powered 3Q76 Norwich to Derby RTC. The monthly gauging train ran to the coast on the 28th, however, due to the shortage of operable Colas Cl.37's the power was 37610 t&t DBSO 9703 rather than two 37s.

57002 was noted in Norwich Yard on the 8th having arrived in the area from Barrow Hill with ex-DRS stock for Eastern Rail Services at Great Yarmouth. On the 5th 90015 was seen in the centre road at Norwich on a driver training run from Ipswich to Norwich and return.

The main events of the month were tours with two on the 16th. The first seen was 37688 and D6851 running ecs from Stowmarket to Norwich. The pair had already been in Norwich to the day before and also earlier in the day in relation to moves on and off the MNR. This was a private Jeremy Hoskins tour to various points in the country. On arriving in Norwich from Stowmarket three coaches were detached from the train and stabled in Norwich Yard. The now shorter set later departed Norwich for Marks Tey. The stabling of the stock in Norwich for the day gave the opportunity to see four Cl.37s together in Norwich, 37668, D6851, 37401 and 37218. The first time this has occurred for a little while.

The second tour was also a LSL service this time operating under the InterCity banner. This was the 1Z75 Manchester - Great Yarmouth and return tour powered by D213 t&t 47593. The 47 was used to pull the tour from Great Yarmouth to Norwich enabling the 40 to haul the tour back to Manchester. The ensemble looked splendid heading to Great Yarmouth and passing the River Yare to the east of Norwich.

The fun continued on the 18th when D1935 ran light from LSL Crewe to Norwich to collect the three

coaches left for the private tour on Saturday and haul then to Tonbridge West Yard. The loco was noted coupled to the stock in Norwich Yard waiting to the time to head south.

Sadly 55009 failed during the first day of the GCR Diesel Gala on the 29th April 2022. This will also rule it out of attending the SVR Diesel Gala in May.

142011 originally acquired as a spares donor has itself been rescued through acquisition of more spares, so is being repainted ahead of entering service, as seen above at Butterley, MRB on the 3rd April 2022 by Darren Bailey.

With its boiler ticket now expired, A4 4-6-2 60009 *UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA* is to stay in Bury forming the centrepiece of a revamped display in Bury Transport Museum. Due to be installed in May 2022, unfortunately to accommodate such a large exhibit, several non-railway items, including traction engines, were given only four weeks' notice to quit. Thankfully they have all been given a new home at Statfold Barn Rly.







The Perils of Rail Travel by Gareth Patterson:

My journey by rail from Berwick -upon-Tweed to Crewe for our AGM turned into somewhat of a nightmare. It started straight away as I thought I was never going to leave Berwick. I was booked on the LNER 1W02 Leeds - Aberdeen service (800102) due 09.32 but annoyingly an idiot on the line at Morpeth brought this to a standstill. Knowing this would have a knock on effect for my connection at Edinburgh Waverley I went and asked if I could then board the TPE service that was in front of my disrupted train the 9S09 Newcastle - Edinburgh (802206) due 10.11 but

this was also brought to a standstill due to livestock on the line at Alnmouth. Anyway, it eventually arrived and I set off at 10:39 but this meant I arrived into Edinburgh Waverley at 11.30, 27mins late but 62mins after when 1W02 should have arrived. This meant I missed my connection, so with an hour to kill I headed to the 'Jinglin' Geordie' bar for a drink and to get out of the cold. I arrived back at Waverley in time to board the 12.52 9M56 Edinburgh - London Euston eventually getting in to Crewe around 16.00.

Could My return trip get any worse, the answer was...YES

So having staved Saturday night at Crewe Sunday saw me board the 10.55 2H42 Crewe - Manchester Piccadilly (323226) departing platform 1 bang on time and got into Piccadilly on time at 11.43. Once there I discovered no trains were running to York due to a strike. So I was Informed I needed to jump onto a Metrolink tram and head for Victoria where trains are running from there to York. Now thankfully I knew where to go due to myself and Peter Britcliffe's trip to Bury a few years back, otherwise I would been like a fish out of water. Having arrived at Victoria I was told head to platform 3 for the TPE 1P25 Manchester Victoria - York (185133 + 185130) and find a seat up front as an imminent announcement would see hordes descending on the train. However no sooner had I sat down than another station employee told us all to get off as we needed to go to Piccadilly!! Farcical isn't the word, but at this point her walkie-talkie informed her that this was incorrect. So I re-boarded, but by now the train was heaving, but at least I managed to find a seat. However, it then left late due to the volume of passengers cramming every space possible, so another connection at York was missed. Once I arrived at York it was another trip to the ticket office where I was informed to jump on the XC 1S43 Bristol Temple Meads - Glasgow (220007 + 220011) departing platform 11 at 14.30. Great I thought, I'm on my final leg home nothing can go wrong can it? I pulled into Newcastle where there was an announcement on the train saving anyone onboard with a LNER ticket heading north of Newcastle these tickets are not valid so you will have to alight here or pay for another fare, yes you guessed it I had a LNER ticket...we need integrated national ticketing, ed. Suffice to say I stayed on board and eventually arrived home at 17.15...happy?. well not really as by then I was coming down with Covid!!



The Spa Valley Railway, as part of its 25th Anniversary year, held a 'Scottish Steam Up' themed gala to kick off the year over the weekend of the 2nd-3rd April 2022. I visited on the Sunday of the event. A day that started sunny and chilly but clouded up in the afternoon.

Visiting loco for the event was

Caledonian Railway 0-4-4T 419 (Courtesy of Bo'ness & Kinneil Railway). This joined fellow Caledonian Railway loco 0-6-0 828 (courtesy of the Strathspey Railway), which is on a long term visit at the Spa Valley Railway. Also in service from the home fleet were Bulleid BoB 4-6-2 34053 SIR KEITH PARK

and Hunslet 0-6-0 2890 (ex-0-6-0ST Austerity converted to a tender engine). All the steam engines faced Tunbridge Wells. 34053 is in the last six weeks of its boiler certificate and currently carries its nameplate on one side only.



For the event the station name boards were changed to a blue background and the Bullied was bulled

up at the front and given a blue smoke box number. Even the Real Ale and Cider bar on one train set had a Scottish theme with beers from Cairngorm Brewery, Aviemore and ciders from Thistly Cross, Scotland.

The main services over the whole line were worked by 419, 828 and 34053, using a mix of seven BR Mk1s and a BR Mk2 in two rakes of four, one with a buffet, one with the Real Ale bar. 2890 was employed on occasional brake van rides using Queen Mary Brake 56296 between Tunbridge Wells and Groombridge, then on the Sunday, shunting duties at Tunbridge Wells. A duty that was covered by D3489 COLONEL TOMLINE on the Saturday. The timetable required loco run rounds at Tunbridge Wells, so these extra shunting duties are required as Bullied 34053 is too long to fit into the run round headshunt at Tunbridge Wells. 34053 is detached at the station throat to run into the yard and the pilot engine attaches to pull the train into the platform. The track layout at Eridge means that engine swaps happen there, the locomotive laying over in what is now the bay platform between services. Services pass in a loop to the south of Groombridge station. The timetable worked well, the first train from Tunbridge Wells was a



Scottish double header, but then coupling issues with the first return train from Eridge left services obstinately running about 10 mins late for the rest of the day.





Seen in the long siding at Groombridge were Cl.489 DMLV No.9104 and ex BRT staff coach DB 977168 amongst the engineers and freight wagons.

In the sidings outside Tunbridge Wells West station were Cl.207 1317, part restored 09026, sheeted over 15224 and Cl.421 1497. 33063 was alongside Drewry 0-6-0 2591 SOUTHERHAM in the headshunt.

Stabled in the yard outside the shed were D348, 31430 *Sister Dora* and 73140.



Though a good Gala it was marred by the serious failure of 813 on the 23rd as the casting supporting the rear springs fractured and in fact pierced the cab floor. This will be a time consuming and costly

repair further reducing much needed income from a loco already 7 years into its boiler certificate, ed.

TRAM, LIGHT RAIL & METRO NEWS

Manchester Metrolink by Geoff Hope:

April 2022: On the 4th it was announced that Metrolink will receive £20.5m from a National Funding Pot of more than £150m to support bus and tram services across England for the next 6 months. The 6th April was the 30th anniversary of the opening of the Metrolink network from Bury to Manchester Victoria.

Between the 4-30th further engineering works were completed between Media City & Eccles. The work saw replacement of worn track at a number of locations with further work planned later in 2022. More double trams were in use on the Media City / Ashton service. On the 10th no trams operated between Whitefield and Bury due to engineering works. On the 24th more engineering works on the Rochdale line meant no trams operated between Freehold and Rochdale town centre. Costings for a full-time policing unit on the Greater Manchester Transport network including Metrolink would be in excess of £20m. It has been reported over the last 12 months that 145 trams and 300 buses had been attacked. On the 26th a 14 year old male was arrested following reports of a knifepoint robbery aboard a tram between Sale Water Park and the City Centre, the first incident I believe reported and hopefully the last.

Tram 3137 was observed in service on the 31st March on an East Didsbury / Rochdale service less than 4 weeks from arrival. On the 2nd, 11th and 30th April respectively trams 3138/39/40 arrived at Queens

Road Depot for commissioning and mileage accumulation. On the 21st 3138 was observed in service on an East Didsbury / Rochdale service. Another arrival was a Zephir Crab 2100e battery electric shunter now being used at Queens Road depot for shunting trams around the depot.


