Secondly apologies for the late arrival of this issue which is simply down to the impossibility of fitting life into too little time and that is without working, though quite frankly this is a full time job. Family commitments took out two weeks, including a first trip to the Sussex coast since Jan 2020, I then fell ill on our return during which it then took time getting ready to travel away for our Scunthorpe visit followed by the DRS Open Day (another 11 days away). Packing the car with ICRS stock for our first event in 2½ years was not easy, as we now have to travel with Mom and all her disability needs On our return I needed to sort out my photos of our trips and the mammoth task of identifying stock seen at Scunthorpe steelworks so I could write a report which with photo restrictions was agreed by our hosts on the day, AFRPS. During this time, I had hardly answered the hundreds of emails received or consequently downloaded the accompanying photos which then took time to catch up on. With other essential aspects of domestic life and looking after Mom also to be fitted in, that took out around six weeks and I was only able to start editing this issue towards the end of July. Suffice to say you will get a double helping of TRACKS as the Aug issue will follow this guite quickly more or less on time. In editing two mags at the same time I at least could switch articles around to fit. The DRS Open Day and Scunthorpe visit reports will appear in the Aug issue but with so much to report on. I have stuff ready for Sep as well already. In trying to catch up, my birthday came and went, spent editing but as the weather has been much cooler and often wet since returning north three weeks ago, unlike the south ...no heatwave here, it has not been so frustrating being chained to a computer indoors.


One good thing about the travelling on our two trips south, apart from 3000 miles of driving, was I had the chance to call in at many preservation sites not seen since 2019 or earlier. This allowed me to pick up on the many changes of stock over the last couple of years in particular, essential for relaying back through **TRACKS** but also for editing our books. What was however noticeable was the changes in access etc that have taken place causing difficulty in some cases. The negative aspects of travelling long distances around the UK are the price of fuel, up 50% in that time and booking accommodation, certainly at previously cheap rates which has been made more difficult by staycations.

The problems of lack of time however did also mean I couldn't properly plan ahead of travelling, as I

keep meaning to do, so that the odd items of stock, signal boxes etc can be fitted in en route. It is frustrating to get home and discover I literally passed by something of railwav Conversely the fun is coming upon something by accident or just plain following your nose, as happened between the Scunthorpe visit and DRS Open Day whilst visiting some nature reserves / gardens etc to give the girls something other than railways. I always carry OS 1:50,000 maps so at least each day I could see if there might be signal boxes nearby through educated guesses by locating level crossings. I have however found more signal portacabins than actual boxes but we do see different scenery. Following my nose led to locating the Cl.332 cars at the new Siemens facility. as I knew it was in Goole...somewhere !! I also found Barrow Haven station being re-built.

On visits we have just got another date for Crewe Basford Hall in late October but note the later start time, see **EVENTS**. Dates and venues are currently being sorted for 2023 so watch this space but in the meantime please support the remaining 2022 visits which can be booked. KWV and Eastleigh.

Sales: As some of you will already have discovered through our website and social media



platforms, we will soon be releasing the first in a pictorial album series of books, pictures not numbers. Entitled **Locos in the Pre-Privatisation Era**, the first in what will hopefully be a long series is **Shunter Hunter Class 08**. Compiled by Colin Pottle and Doug Slater, the preface says it all so I have reproduced it here:

This book is intended to be used as a pictorial record to accompany the UK Rail Series spotting books, of what you could expect to see around the multitude of depots, marshalling yards and sidings from the late 1970s up until the 1st April 1994, after which date British Rail started to be broken up into sectors ready to become fully privatised. At almost every large station on the network could be found the solitary 'Station Pilot' lurking in a siding with a few parcel wagons, or on the centre through roads, ready for the next set of coaches to be moved. Unloved, unwashed and quite often faded well beyond anything else seen on the main line, these little workhorses plied their trade relentlessly, often hauling much larger loads than they were designed for without too much complaint, as some of the pictures inside reveal. As a testament to their design there are still over 300 examples existing, either stored or working around the country. Most are with preserved railways or private collections, where they still hold their own, although some mainline companies have extolled the virtue of keeping a few examples on their books. Also included are the derivatives of the Class 08s — Class 09s, regeared to allow faster running up to 27mph, and Class 13s which, based at Tinsley, were two Class 08s permanently coupled together with the centre cab removed.

The book is perfect bound ie with a spine not wire bound and 96 pages, giving you 143 never before seen classic photos of in this case Cl.08/09 shunters. The price is £10 for members + £2 P&P if ordered separately, though if ordered with other books then that will vary and invariably be cheaper. So at a max of £12 it is really good value. Even better if you pick up a copy at our events, the next major one being Eastleigh in September. The book is expected to arrive from our printers in late August.

Please support this venture so that further books can be released, the next one most likely being Cl.25s.

EVENTS

There are just five events remaining from our 2022 programme, with an additional visit to Basford Hall in Oct added this month. Other venues or additional dates may be added in due course, so for up to date info always check our website. A start is being made on sorting out provisional dates / venues for 2023 which is our 50th Anniversary, so watch this space.

Pandemic / Hygiene: It is not the time for everyone to get blasé about Covid19 and assume it is ok to catch it. No-one knows the effects the virus can have on individuals and as the average age of members is 65, we are more vulnerable. Many members have underlying health issues and to feel safe we insist that all visit participants must be fully vaccinated up to whatever the current government guidelines state, currently three jabs. For the foreseeable future also please remember to bring a mask as we may be asked to wear them and some may feel safer anyway doing so regardless of guidelines, which still vary throughout the UK. Good idea to bring hand sanitiser as well.

General Booking Conditions: Unless shown otherwise all visits are unlimited. Where limited places the number left is shown in brackets.

Bookings should be made to either Tony Whitehead or Christine Field as stated (if you phone you will most likely get Trevor). Contact details are on p2. Clearly state your name, membership number, and importantly a contact telephone number. If it is for an event with multiple dates eg Carnforth then indicate your preference / availability for the dates shown. Email is best for Tony and he will respond asap. If telephoning Tony please do not call after 20.45 in the evening, as he will be in bed early as he has to be up for work at 04.30 each morning. Best time to ring is after 18.30 weekdays and weekends. Though Tony does not have an answerphone he will return your tel. call promptly if your number is recorded as a missed call, so don't panic. Only if you consistently have any trouble contacting Tony or he hasn't responded after several days then in the last resort contact Christine / Trevor. Note we cannot accept bookings by letter only, as there is no way to quickly contact you if plans are amended at short notice.

Please note no booking / confirmation will be taken if you do not provide full details. As volunteers, neither Tony, Chris or anyone else should have to chase you up if you fail to provide details. It is seconds of your time to get it right but can lead to wasted hours of ours chasing you up if you do not comply. Checking the membership database doesn't always help as it also seems we then find members have not told us about changed telephone numbers or email addresses.

Delay in travelling notwithstanding, please note that there is no excuse for booking then not notifying us you cannot then attend. As with events where numbers need to be accurately known by the hosts for a tour, food or room capacity this is not acceptable. We have tried to ease the official's organising burden

and saving you money in postage by allowing members to pay on the day, but this can be abused as it can be then seen as nothing to lose if you can't be bothered to turn up. It may also prevent your place being offered to someone else. Conversely where numbers permit, we will allow applications right up to the day to be as flexible as possible but do this by phone only as officials will be travelling to the event.

Members Only Visits

West Coast Railways, Carnforth - Sat 8th Oct: FULL

Reserve lists in operation. Cost £25.

Places are limited to a max of 30 per visit (min 20) as it allows questions to be asked of our guide and prevents getting in each other's way...well not too much!!

The tour will take approx. 3 to 3½ hours so if you are travelling by train please arrange your return accordingly. Needing to leave early can cause problems and we don't want to risk future visits. Entry will be at the main access off Jesson Way (Postcode: LA5 9UR, OS Grid Ref: SD 49128 70057) via the A6 and Crag Bank (mini-roundabout), this is the first bridge over the WCML 1.25 miles south of the station. Start: 10.30 so meet no later than 10.00 at the station (Postcode: LA5 9TR, OS Map Ref: SD 49713 70649) where fee will be taken and clothing bought if required. Those who have arrived by train will be ferried down to the entrance. It is a big site especially when you have gone up and down the various lines, requiring stepping over numerous tracks. Therefore, due to the terrain, distance and pace this visit is not advisable for anyone with mobility problems. However should anyone with mobility problems wish to go then transport can be provided within the site to access the main sheds where most of the locos can be seen. Hi-viz jacket / vest, sturdy footwear and hard hat / bump cap required. All photos taken are for private use ONLY, no public display either online, in magazines or via social media.

FL Crewe Basford Hall Yard – Sat 29th Oct 2022 (later start time) Booking OPEN Apply to Tony Places unlimited (currently 0 attending). Cost £15. The 1 hour trip around Basford Hall Yard starts at 14.00 (meet no later than 13.45) from the main gate just off Gresty Road (Postcode: CW2 5AA, OS Map Ref: SJ 70989 53756) ¾ mile from the station. On foot turn left from the main station entrance onto Nantwich Road then first left onto Gresty Road, pass Crewe Alexandra FC then left after ½ mile under the railway bridge opposite DRS Gresty Bridge Depot. Hi-viz jacket / vest required.

Eastleigh Works - Sat 10th Sep 2022: Booking OPEN Apply to Christine

Places unlimited though there is a nominal max of 200 (currently 180 attending). Cost £20. The Works is ½ mile south of the station via A335 Southampton Road which runs adjacent the railway (10-15 min walk). Access is via new main gate off Campbell Road opposite NR building, which is beyond where the lefthand footpath starts. (Postcode: SO50 5AD, OS Map Ref: SU 45661 18367). Only disabled car parking on site but the Swan Centre multi-storey car park is between the station and Campbell Road (Postcode: SO50 5PB). On-street parking may be available but restrictions apply. Please arrive by 13.30 at the latest so that you can be let in, pay your money then gather for the safety briefing, prior to starting your visit at 14.00. It is possible we may be able to start the visit earlier so allow for this in your travel arrangements. The fee covers the normal Arlington visit fee (which they donate to charity) and organising stewards. You will get access to all areas until 16.30 and cab rides...locos TBC. Hi-viz jacket / vest required. It is a deceptively big site, especially when you have gone up and down the various lines and inside Works roads so be prepared to walk. The Works canteen will be open to purchase refreshments.

Keighley & Worth Valley Rly (KWV) - Fri 19th Aug: Booking OPEN Apply to Christine

Max 20 (4). Cost £10. Tour of Haworth Shed / Workshop. Arrive at Haworth 11.45 for 12.00 start (Postcode: BD22 8NJ, OS Map Ref: SE 03476 37221) Other facilities to visit on the line are the free Museum at Oxenhope holding stock awaiting overhaul and Rail Story, two Museums at Ingrow West namely The Engine Shed (Bahamas Loco Society) and Carriage Shed (vintage Carriages Trust). Cost of the Rail Story museums is Adults - £5 and Concessions - £4. There is free car parking at Oxenhope,

Ingrow West with a £3 charge at Howarth. There is P&D car parking at Keighley but not advisable as shared with mainline station so busy. If you book a rover ticket in advance you get free entry to the museums, Adult - £17, Concessions - £14.45. We have left it up to you how you visit the various facilities other than the shed as it was impossible to work out an easy route round by booking a train as on a Fri there are only four round services. If you are travelling by train then the first KWV service from Keighley is at 10.50 arriving into Haworth at 11.10. If you are coming by car but then book a rover you can park at Oxenhope and there are two trains to Haworth before 12.00, 10.00 (arr 10.06) and 11.40 (arr 11.46)

East Lancs Rly (ELR) - Sat 20th Aug: Booking CLOSED

Max 20 (FULL) Reserve list in operation. Cost £15. Start 10.00, duration 3 hours. Meet 09.15 at Bury Bolton Street Station (Postcode: BL9 0EY, Map Ref: SD 80254 10813). Pay & Display car parking available around station. Bury Metrolink stop 5 min walk. This is oversubscribed as it is the only visit allowed by ELR in 2022. We will apply for further visits in 2023. Cost & timings to be notified to attendees. Hi-viz jacket / vest required.

Long Marston - 2023: TBC

We have provisional agreement from Porterbrook to be able to visit in 2023, Date and full details TBC

PRESERVATION PHOTO SPOT: STEAM



This loco has an interesting history with multiple owners and names. It was built in 1916 to work at the Ministry of Munitions factory, Gretna Green where named *MITCHELL*. Sold in n 1928 to Bradford Corp it then worked on the Nidd Valley Light Rly (NVLR) and later named *ILLINGWORTH*. On closure of the NVLR in 1936 it moved to the Ebbw Vale steelworks under the ownership of Robert McAlpine until 1940 and named *HAROLD* then sold onto Mowlems, its last industrial owner. With them it undertook war work at Swynnerton and Ruddington where named *SWYNNERTON* then moved to Workington breakwater in 1945 then onto Braehead PS until withdrawn for scrap in 1957. At this point locos usually do get scrapped or saved into preservation but 1208 disappeared passing through several hands until discovered in a Norfolk garden by its current owner Stephen Middleton and moved to EMB. It was finally steamed again in May 2017 and reunited with its *ILLINGWORTH* nameplates (see photo in the June 2017 issue p26). To show support for front line workers it was renamed in Apr 2022 to honour nurses of the past, Florence Nightingale and Mary Jane Seacole and is currently on hire to LWR as seen above

43059 is being prepped to be repainted in 'Midland' Pullman blue livery. 59205 departed for Merehead on 27/06 following repairs.

43468 + 43465 departed for Kings Norton on 10/06 and returned on 27/06 after attending Rail Live (see below passing Basingstoke at 11.55 on 10/06 by Spencer Conquest).





66720 was released on 28/06 in Wascosa livery. Contrary to what's been reported, both the blue and orange are different to standard GBRf equivalents, although the paint scheme is the same. 66729 arrived with six new Wascosa wagons (MLA 81 70 5932 284-9, FEA 81 70 4524 066-7/070-9/064-2/098-0, JNA 81 70 5932 167-6). The FEAS showed the four variations with three different modules. The locos then took the consist to London Victoria where the nameplate *Wascosa* on 66720 was unveiled.

The first Hitachi unit, 802003, for crack repairs arrived on 27/06 (see opposite top on 29/06)





313121 arrived back from Hornsey on 27/06.

The CI.769 modification projects are now complete and the last units have now left; 769936 and 940 to LM on 10/06 and 769939 and 769947 to LM on 01/07.

Scrapping: The bodies from 142056 were scrapped on 14/06 with the cabs retained (see 55752 left). For 55706 (see Aug issue)

LHC: Mk1 FO 3107 is now repainted in BR crimson & cream.

D6817 arrived with 41059 for CET fitting on 06/06, returning the following day with CET fitted 41182 and repainted 3107. 5991 was used as a barrier for both moves (see below).

Mk1 RBR 1671 is now repainted BR blue/grey and awaits decal fitting.

Mk2 FO 3325 is currently in primer ahead of a coat of BR blue/grey.

66074 arrived with Pullman Car *IBIS* (99534) from Stewarts Lane on 28/06 returning with Mk1 Generator Car 6313 the same evening (see opposite top)

This year's Rail Live at Long Marston, showcase for all things to with the latest technology in the rail



industry and in particular OTP, was held over the 22nd-23rd June 2022. Though marred by rail strikes it was successful. Attended by Roger Harris below is a partial stock list of items either on display or stored, though not all was visible or identifiable.

left barrier 96603 Oliver (+ 96605) with inset of RIV numbering hauled by 43468 + 43465 on Long Marston – Nemesis Rail, Norton Jnct, Worcester 24th June 2022 (David Moreton)

Railway Support Services (RSS) showed off its imported and adapted Canadian three axle TP70 intended to replace the venerable Cl.08s of which it now has 60. The replacement fleet however will be

based on a similar TP60 design adapted to UK loading gauge, the first of which is likely to be ready in 2023. The new locos will be environmentally friendly using 92% less diesel and will be capable of moving 3000t, twice that of a Cl.08, up to a max speed of 25mph.

FRANCHISE / NETWORK NEWS

As threatened by the rail unions, a series of strikes have taken place with more to come. Days already disrupted have been 21st, 23rd and 25th June, 27th and 30th July with planned strikes on 18th and 20th August 2022.

Even with all the chaos and uncertainty of current disputes, it appears passenger numbers are continuing to grow with 92% of pre-covid levels being hit on the 25th May 2022. With leisure travel on the increase ,it has reached 104% in some parts of the country. The danger is now that future plans, based on the travel patterns of 2020-21 might now be wrong.

On the railtour / excursion front, Steam Dreams has been sold to LSL which also includes the sale of B1 4-6-0 61306 MAYFLOWER.

The DfT has awarded a new National Rail Contract to GWR to continue operating until 21st June 2025.

INFRASTRUCTURE NEWS

Historical Railways Estate (HRE): Further to the report on p30 in the Apr 2022 issue, the retrospective planning permission by National Highways (NH) for the infilling of Great Musgrave bridge in Cumbria was unanimously rejected on the 16th June 2022 by Eden District Council. The arrogant behaviour of NH beggars' belief, in not only going ahead in the first place but to then try to 'bribe' objectors with promises to do other work knowing they were facing a huge reinstatement bill but only if the planning permission was granted. Over 900 objections to the planning application against just two for, one of whom would have benefited from other works, certainly swung the decision. NH is now faced

with a £430,000 cost on to pf the £124,000 it overspent when it could have simply applied pointing to complete the necessary repairs. NH has now been hugely embarrassed with its reputation in shreds so requiring its other projects to now all be re-evaluated.

Stations: As reported in the last issue below are photos taken on the 28th June 2022 of the new Reston station on the ECML in Berwickshire 're-opened' on the 23rd May 2022. It is 12 mins north of Berwick-upon-Tweed by rail and though in a fairly rural area adjacent the A1, it serves the towns of Coldingham and Eyemouth on the nearby coast.

Trimley station on the Felixstowe branch from Ipswich has been receiving much needed attention with the footbridge being refurbished and OHL wiring replaced. The station building, out of use since closure for over 50 years and now in a poor state, was to be saved by the 'Friends of Trimley Station' who were offered a 2 year lease in 2011 by NR to initially waterproof it. With little happening NR announced the station was to be demolished in 2019 but would hand over the lease if funding could still be raised, but after 10 years of campaigning and failed Lottery Bids that now seems unlikely.







PRESERVATION NEWS

Misc News: One bit of good news for the heritage steam industry is that lump coal can be supplied again from Ffos-Y-Fran colliery in Wales, as the screening equipment has been re-commissioned. Unfortunately this is only a temporary fix as it is due to close in November 2022.

Coupled with rising costs. CHV has taken the decision to conserve stocks of coal with all services on



certain running days operated by its fleet of diesels, 33021/102 and newly arrived 47292, once overhauled. This applied to the 11th and 25th June 2022.

BBR has sold 30064 (WD 1959) USATC S100 0-6-0T a long-time resident which has been on the line since 1971 but not operated since 1984, It has been stored at Horsted Keynes where it was slowly deteriorating. It is intended that restoration will take 5-6 years. The

photo above was taken on the 22nd October 2010 prior to a jolly away to the NEC to feature at the Warley Model Railway Exhibition that year.

As reported in **FRANCHISE / NETWORK NEWS** Barry Tourist Rly has lost the use of the former BR Depot at Barry though it is still allowed to use the Exhibition Shed at Plymouth Road plus four sidings. However this means it will have to sell some of its stock including Cl.101 DMU 50338 + 50222 Laboratory Iris II, three ex-Gatwick Mk2s + GLV DT 68509 (9110) and possibly a Cl.73 if needed with the coaches to form a push pull set. Wagons for sale are three PCAs and a CDA. The railway is currently closed whilst TfW undertake infrastructure upgrades.

Ecclesbourne Valley Rly (EVR): Having not been to EVR since Jun 2019 I had the chance to call in twice recently so it was good to catch up on the many changes that have happened during the

pandemic. Seen elsewhere in this issue is D1842 on long term hire, 55006 under repair and 55034 temporarily on site at Wirksworth. 55019 ROYAL HIGHLAND FUSILIER has been on hire but recently left on the 18th July 2022 for the GWR Summer Diesel Gala. Mk1 RMB 1874 which arrived from BWR

in early 2022 has been positioned between ex-Gatwick coaches at Wirksworth station as a buffet, gaining pseudo pullman livery on the public facing side and the name *APOLLO*. The other side still carries BR chocolate & cream livery (see below right).

Work at intermediate station Shottle has seen a signal box erected. This was originally at Oddingly built in 1906 and decommissioned in Oct 2016. On the 12th June 2020 it was lifted into place on top of a new steel lower frame. This will allow regular two train operation with trains passing at Shottle, currently only practicable on special events. In the photo below the signal box can be seen at the northern end of the platform loop with stock in the siding including Cl.121 DMU 977975 (55027) the ex-Severn Tunnel emergency Train.





Another signal box has also arrived at Wirksworth, formerly at Sneiton Jnct which closed in 2013. Seen left on the 17th July 2022.



Another item of stock moved to EVR at the end of 2021 is 1973 built Matisa R7D Ballast Regulator 519 [6295],

previously stored at Wolsingham, WEA, as seen below on the 27th June 2022 at the end of the headshunt north of Cemetery Lane bridge, Wirksworth. The photo below at Wolsingham, WEA on the 22nd March 2018 and shows the opposite end.





Also moving along is the LMS 10000 Project, formed in 2011 by the Ivatt Diesel Recreation Society, which established a base at Wirksworth in 2019 (see below). The aim of this project is to recreate 10000 one of the two scrapped 1947 built LMS Ivatt pioneer mainline diesels, the other being 100001 (the scrapping of which in 1968 featured in the May 2021 issue, p18). The basis of the reconstruction will use a genuine English Electric 16SVT engine, CI.77 EM2 bogies the frames of 58022 which after acquisition from DBC was stored at Rowsley, PEA (see Dec 2016 issue, p60). Stripping of 58022 began in late 2020 after movement to Wirksworth in Aug 2020 with one cab remaining (see below), the other having been auctioned off in late 2021. The 1947 built engine virtually identical to the that fitted to 10000 was acquired in 2012 and is almost as good as new having been kept indoors with the MoD as a standby generator and serviced regularly. 58022 was bought in 2016. The bogies, again almost identical to those fitted to 10000, are the only spare ones remaining built by Metropolitan Vickers and latterly used in he Netherlands from where they were bought in 2019 (see below).



North York Moors Rly (NYM): Work to reconstruct four life expired bridges along the line was completed between Jan – Mar 2022 with the last two at Goathland. At over 150 years old the larger bridges on the northern half of the line in particular needed attention and all four cross the Eller Beck which shares the valley route. Planned since the early 2000s, all the bridges were to be new structures capable of carrying 23t axle loadings and the hammer blows of large steam locos. The first bridge to tackled, a 25m skew span, was No.30 in 2010, but then funds needed to be raised through the Lottery and a variety of other organisations, totalling £9.7 million with the title 'Yorkshire's Magnificent Journey'. Incidentally this funding package included the new carriage shed at Pickering. The next bridge to

tackled, a 20m skew double track span, was No.27 at Goathland Station (see opposite bottom). Both these bridges required Kirow rail cranes as there was no road access. This left Nos. 24 and 25, both 20m spans with 24 square and 25 skewed, completed as stated above using a road crane as road access was possible at this location via Goathland House.




Nene Valley Rly (NVR): Work to alter the car park at Wansford has also seen a miniature railway installed along the storage track between the station building and the workshop. During the brief visit en route south on the 26th June 2022, recent arrival Pacer Cl.143602 was seen along with the restored Swedish trailer 1987 *Haggar* to work with its partner railcar 1212 *Helga*, though neither were carrying their names. The trailer will provide extra capacity on offpeak services including an accessible area.



North Norfolk Rly (NNR) Mixed Traffic Gala: The NNR is a picturesque 5 mile line between the market town of Holt and the Seaside town of Sheringham on the North Norfolk Coast. One of the highlights of their operating season is the Mixed Traction Gala which this year was held between the 10-12th June 2022. It was the first such event since the pandemic began and had two guest locos, D7659 (courtesy of Waterman Railways / Peak Railway) and 37401 (courtesy of DRS). As the brakes on 37401 were incompatible with the coaching stock on the line, it ran doubleheaded with D5631 throughout, although D5631 did also work some trains on its own. Resident traction in use was BR Std 2-6-2 76084, Y14 0-6-0 564, D3935, D5631, D6732 and Cl.101 DMUs 52062 + 51228, 51192 + 51185



On Saturday, the event didn't go to plan with the failure of both D3935 and D6732 with both locos needing to be rescued causing significant disruption to the timetable. Visiting D7659 also suffered an electrical problem and was briefly out of action but thankfully soon repaired. The loco shortages did mean the use of the railways popular Vintage Carriage set had to be abandoned on Sunday.



(Stuart) visited on the afternoon, the 11th, to find that the timetable had been replaced by an emergency timetable due to a number of failures (see above). Expecting little to be happening and not much to see I only stayed for a short while. However, I was very impressed with how the NNR staff and volunteers handled the situation. With the Cl.25 repaired and released back to traffic, the timetable was operating at one train every 30 minutes with all services appearing to be well loaded.

supplied 68004 *Rapid* arriving direct from its depot at Carlisle and Freightliner supplied 70020 on the Sunday, which I didn't get to see.




A lot of the services were double headed and lots of different combinations were used throughout the

COACHING MATTERS



Built by LNER in 1943 as Gresley Gangwayed Passenger Brake Pigeon Van, 70754 was preserved in 1991 after ending its days in departmental service as internal user 041366. Being stored outside at the Stephenson Railway Museum (SRM) the weather took its toll and restoration was slow, but in 2019 it was moved to DC Engineering & Restorations, Shildon. It then moved onto Wirksworth, EVR in 2020 where restoration was completed and is now situated at Goathland station, NYM as an education centre and disabled toilet.

TRAM, LIGHT RAIL & METRO NEWS

West Midlands Metro: Services resumed on the 9th June 2022 following sufficient trams being repaired.

Manchester Metrolink by Geoff Hope:

June 2022: On the 31st May two elderly male tram passengers were assaulted by a group of yobs as they got off the tram at Newbold (Rochdale line) all because they asked them to stop vaping on the tram, one finished up on the tram tracks the other was punched to the ground. Yet another first for depraved behaviour. On the 1st June, delays were experienced on the Airport line due to youths using items to obstruct the Overhead Lines.

On the 13th June one day Travel Cards via the Get Me There app. will be withdrawn as part of a crackdown on fare evasion. It would appear that a number of passengers are attempting to travel without paying, only paying for a ticket when inspections take place. Single ticket and Day Travel Cards will be issued by ticket machines in future.

The 17th June was not one of the best days for Metrolink several all incidents affecting services during evening rush hour. The Ashton line was involved in a police incident with trams only able to run between Ashton - Clayton Hall the Eccles section as far as Piccadilly. The second and third incidents involved tram 3141 on its first day in service scuffing a bus on Princess Street close to St. Peters Square then at Chorlton tram stop, two trams 'kissed', the driver misjudged the distance between trams Only the second time I believe this has happened. All three trams involved were taken out of service but with very little damage and no injuries involved. Late in the evening a male was hit by a tram affecting the East Didsbury service at West Didsbury but not known how serious his injuries were

Tram 3075 is now advertising the Trafford Centre with a third advert Exclusively for Everyone. Tram 3087 is now advertising Paramount a mountain of entertainment, though this has subsequently changed again. Trams 3076 / 3088 have lost the NCCO & Pillow Talk adverts respectively.

On the 6th/25th June trams 3142 / 3143 arrived at Queens Road Depot for commissioning and mileage accumulation. On the 7th June tram 3140 entered service on the Eccles / Media City – Ashton service. T68 tram 1016 departed Long Marston for scrap during June 2021 due to serious vandalism damage, leaving 1022 / 1024 / 1026 stored on behalf of UK Trams.




